Guidelines:

- 1. Choose your courses for the Fall based on the assumption that you have completed summer classes successfully.
- 2. Be aware that there is no guarantee of a spot in a senior class if you advance through summer. You will be placed on a waitlist and seniors will have priority if there is a lack of space.
- 3. Have your parent/guardian email me informing me they intend to have you do an ACADEMIC summer class (foundational courses need no email) and indicate which course that will be.
 - a. Example: Tracy will be taking Science 10 in the summer and is choosing Physics 11 for September.
