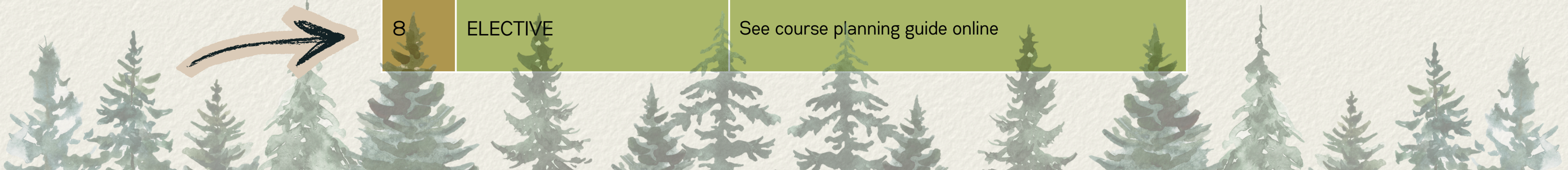


Typical FRENCH PROGRAM Grade 9 Course load

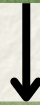

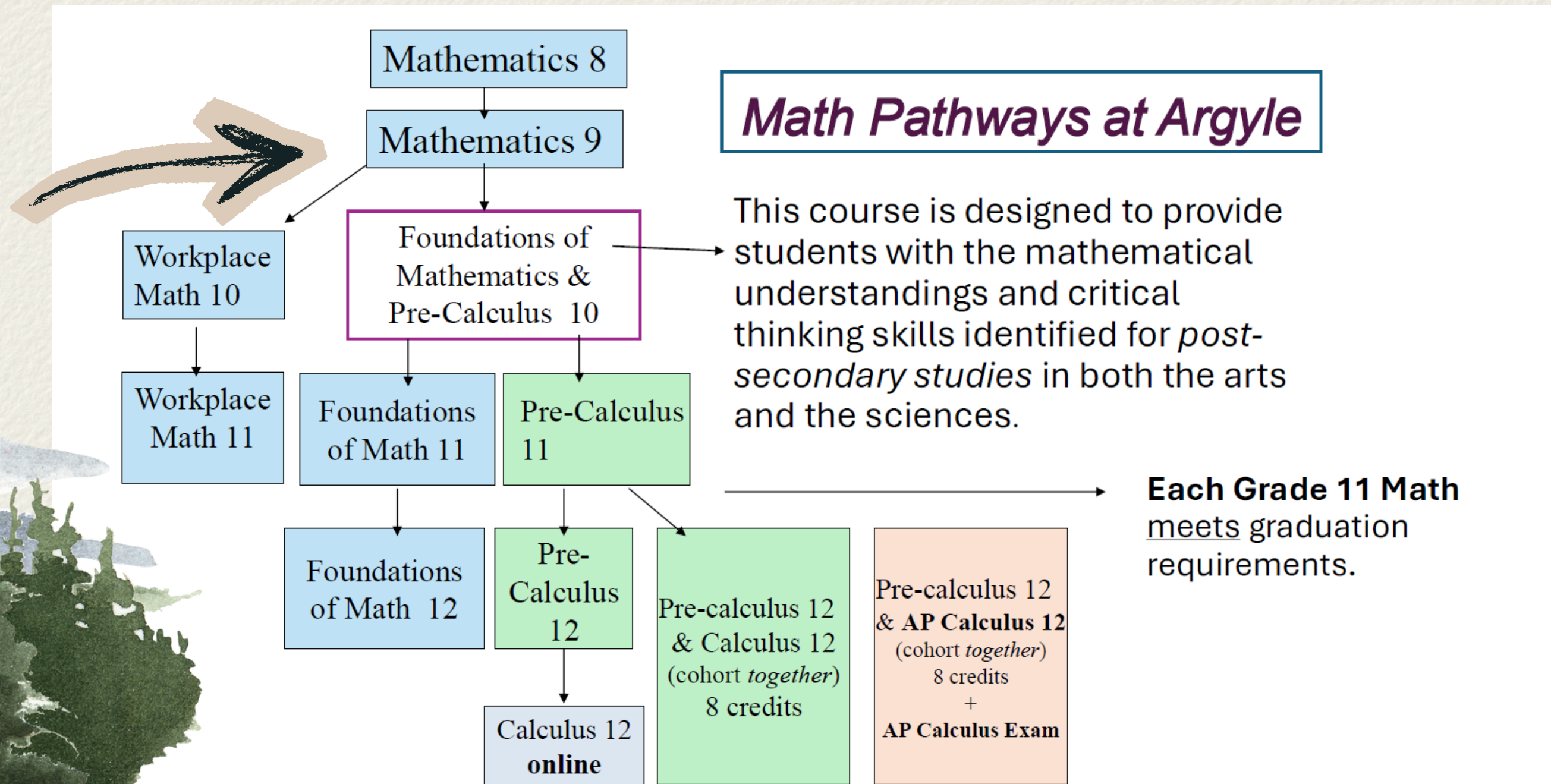

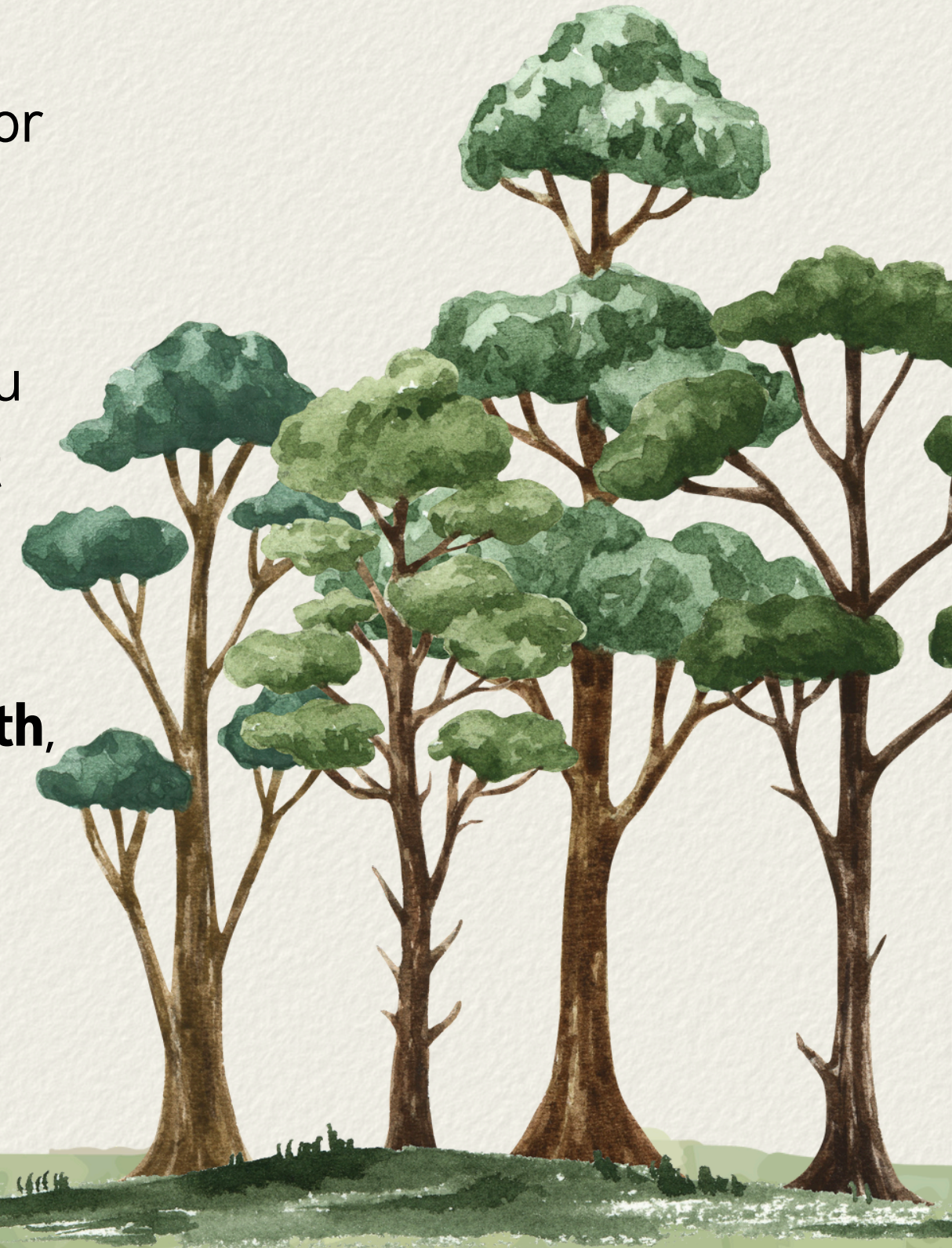

ALTERNATE CLASSES
All students going into Grade 9 must choose 3 alternate elective classes. Alternate classes are chosen in case your priority electives are full.

LAC & ELL
NOTE: you will not be able to select a learning support class or ELL class. They will be assigned by Mr. de Couto after recommendations are made from the teachers.

Academy / PEAK program
Students who are applying to either PEAK or a sports academy will need to email Mr. de Couto directly. For now, please select a full course load and your schedule will be modified later.

INSTRUCTIONS
1. Click on SELECT to begin your selections.
2. You must have a minimum of 8 courses total.
3. Click on SELECT for any X-Block courses you wish to take. These are optional and fall outside the timetable.
4. Applications for speciality programs (Academies, PEAK, etc.) are required. More information is available [here](#). Once a student is accepted to an academy or PEAK, selections will be adjusted.
5. Remember to click POST to save your selections.

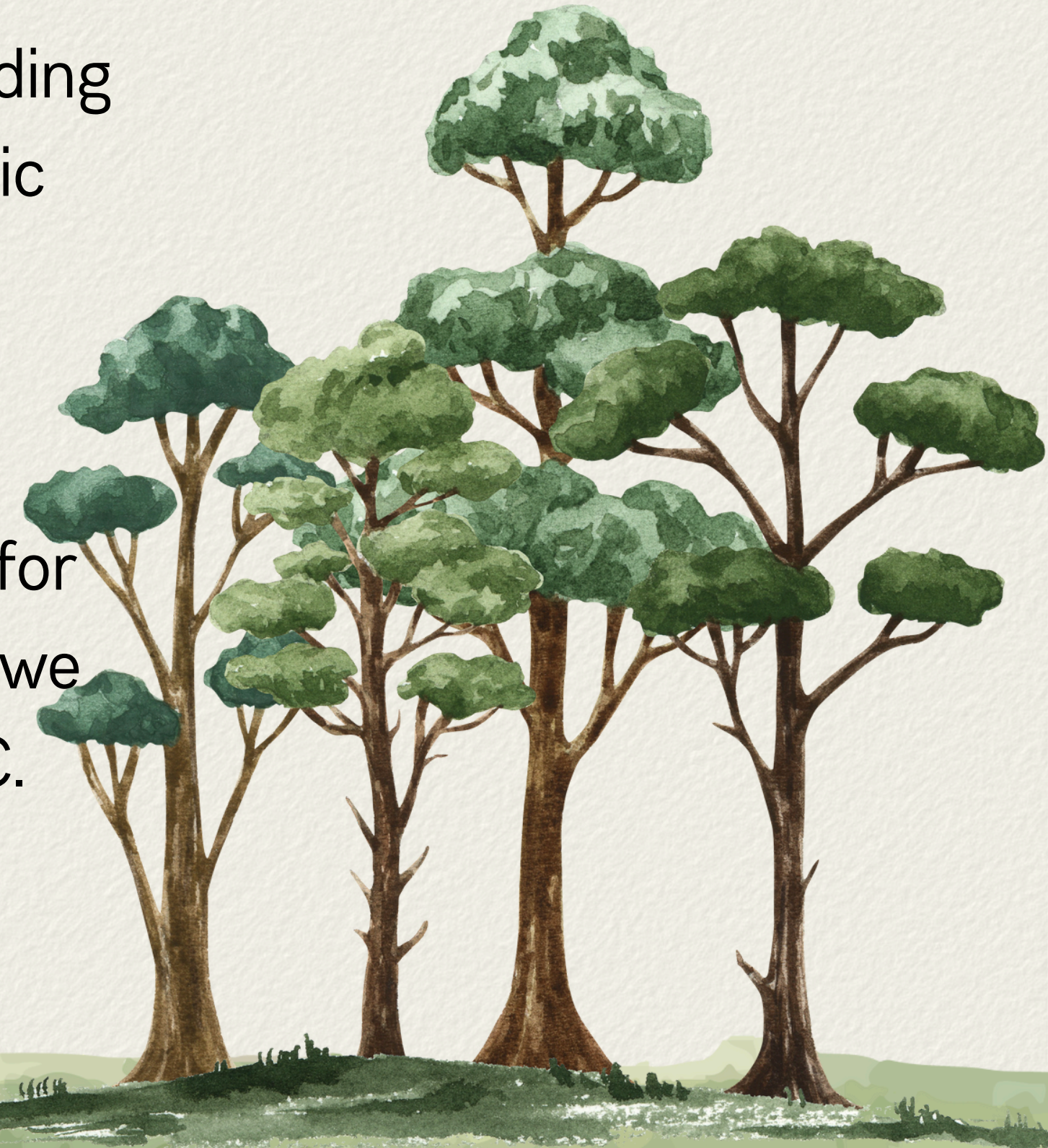

Additional Programs **(for your consideration)**

LAC (Learning Assistance Center)

- Available for students who have been identified as needing extra support in order to be successful in their academic classes.
- Students are referred to LAC by classroom teachers, school-based resource teachers, and counsellors.
- Parents/guardians also sometimes notify us of a need for their child. As a School Based Resource Team (SBRT), we come up with a plan of support, which may include LAC.



LAC Tiers



What are the LAC tiers?

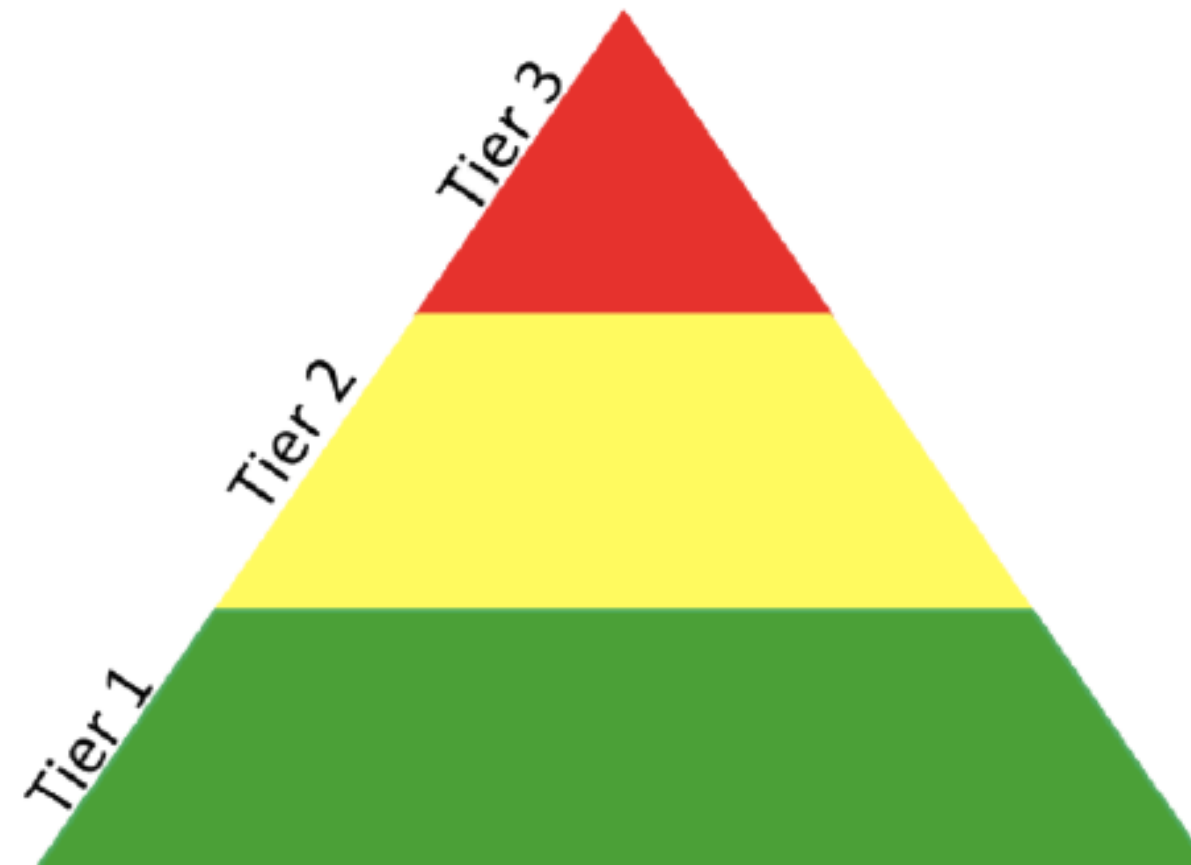
LAC has several tiers to meet the varying support needs of our students and appropriately disperse and allocate our resources. Students may move up or down in these tiers as their needs and supports change.

LAC Tier 1 – Lowest level of support: Students have access to LAC during Tutorials and class time, but there is no mandatory attendance. An LST will take case management of this student and check in with teachers for progress updates.

LAC Tier 2 – Students still retain their full schedule of registered courses. They are required to attend LAC during Tutorials weekly for closer monitoring and have access to LAC during class time during independent work time and quizzes/tests. Most students are in Tier 2 LAC.

- Grade 8 – 9 students also have several morning lessons on executive functioning skills and learning skills such as note-taking, studying and self-advocacy.
- Grade 10 – 12 students can get credit for LAC in Tier 2 upon completion of a portfolio

LAC Tier 3 – Highest level of support: Students replace one of their regular courses with a full block of LAC. Students get support with homework, as well as coaching and lessons on other skills such as organization, time management, self-advocacy, and learning habits.

Enrolling Block of LAC, focus on homework support & skill development in executive functioning/ foundational skills

Tier 1 Supports PLUS
Required LAC Tutorial attendance, focus on executive functioning skills & homework support.

PEAK Performance Alternate Timetable Request

Peak Performance is a non-credit adjusted timetabling request option for elite-level student athletes and performers in Grades 8-12.

- Minimum of 15 hours per week of supervised, year-round training in one sport or discipline at the provincial and/or national level or at the highest category or level for their specific age group.
- Recommendation of coach or person responsible for training program indicating that the applicant is training a minimum of 15 hours per week under their supervision. The letter must also detail the specific training and activities undertaken by the applicant
- Students must **RE-APPLY** each year (**please note that there have been significant updates**)

Submit a completed application to your counsellor as soon as you can, and if you have any questions, please connect with your counsellor.

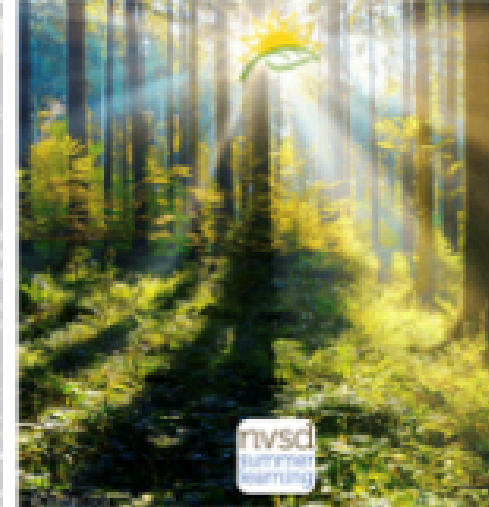
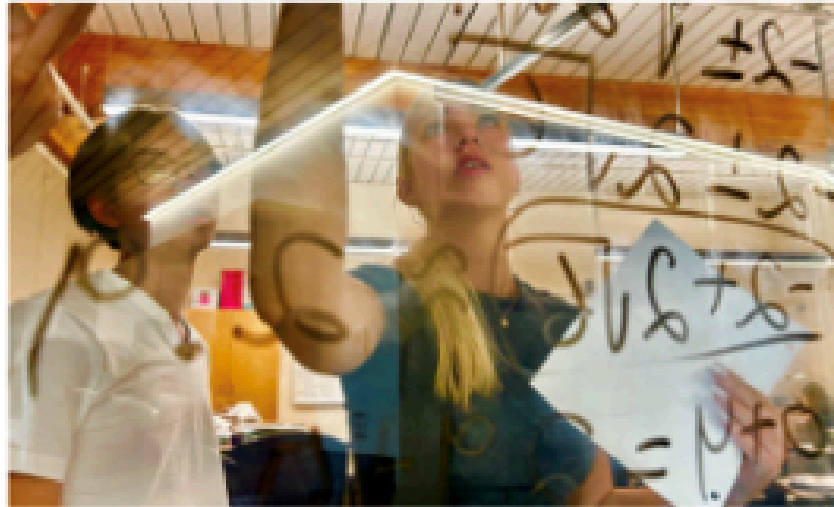
