

THE GORDON AND MARION SMITH FOUNDATION FOR YOUNG ARTIST

The series invites audiences to consider not just what we collect, but why and how. Additionally, the gallery's *Explore and Create* program, a weekly Saturday afternoon art-making workshop for children and families at a zero cost for participants, will continue to be offered.

Together, the Gordon Smith Gallery, Artists for Kids, and the Gordon and Marion Smith Foundation continue to be deeply committed to providing our community with connection, through meaningful engagement with exceptional arts education and experiences through our exhibits and satellite art making locations within the lower mainland. From the Ground explores the interconnectedness of the natural world and our reciprocal relationship with the ecosystems in which we are embedded. It invites us to learn from the more-than-human, expanding our awareness of both the visible and invisible in our environments and broadening our sense of time. The exhibition is rooted in the learning principle articulated by the First Nations Education Steering Committee, which emphasizes "connectedness, reciprocal relationships, and a sense of place." Within the urgency of the climate crisis, From the Ground invites shared dialogue and connection through creative and educational practices.

Throughout the exhibition, drawings, sculptures, prints, and photographs represent the natural world through stories, materials, time, and natural processes. From the Ground features contemporary artists Amelia Butcher, Lauren Brevner, Xinwei Che, James Nexw'Kalus-Xwalacktun Harry, and Genevieve Robertson, alongside works from the Artists for Kids and Gordon Smith Gallery's Permanent Collection.

One Hundred Artists Deep is an experimental exhibition featuring original responses by eight Canadian artists to work from the Artists for Kids and Gordon Smith Gallery's Permanent Collection, specifically by the Collection's founders: Gordon Smith, Jack Shadbolt, and Bill Reid. "One hundred artists deep" is a verbatim quote from Smith himself used to describe how his artistic practice came from a lineage of inspiring practitioners who came before him. This exhibition emphasizes the necessity of looking back to look forward and, consequently, the idea of building a legacy in the present.

ONE HUNDRED ARTISTS DEEP: SHIFTING PERSPECTIVES THROUGH THE COLLECTION

APRIL 10, 2026 TO JUNE 20, 2026

Corey Bulpitt, Kelly Cannell, Andrew Dadson, Alex Gibson, Chantal Gibson, Tiziana La Melia, Veto Monteiro, and Isabel Wynn are all artists based in the Lower Mainland selected for their innovative and diverse contemporary practices. From a curatorial standpoint, their artistic practices either conceptually align with the work of Smith, Shadbolt, and Reid, or they respond to the notion of institutional collections more broadly.

Central to this exhibition are the artists' visions and experiences working with the Artists for Kids and Gordon Smith Gallery's Permanent Collection—their original responses will ultimately guide the curatorial framework, layout, and visitor experience of the exhibition.

SPEAKER SERIES



Formed in 2007, the Black Dog String Quartet is composed of Elyse Jacobson, violin; Molly MacKinnon, violin; John Kastelic, viola; and Doug Gorkoff, cello.

The Black Dog String Quartet has performed with major artists like Rod Stewart, Mariah Carey, and Kanye West, and recorded with acts such as 54-40 and Marianas Trench. They've worked with top producers including Garth Richardson and Joe Chiccarelli. Highlights include opening for Sarah McLachlan and appearing at the Shambhala Music Festival.

Known for their expressive performances, the quartet plays concerts, private events, and studio sessions, and has been featured at festivals like Sonic Boom and Classical Revolution. Their debut album, featuring original music by John Kastelic, was released in April 2023.


ARTISTS FOR KIDS AFTER SCHOOL ART PROGRAM







FALL PORTFOLIO

The 2025 Fall Portfolio features a limited edition print by KWÍKWI: Lauren Brevner and James Nexw'Kalus-Xwalacktun Harry.

KWÍKWI is the collaborative duo of James Nexw'Kalus-Xwalacktun Harry and Lauren Brevner. James, of the Skwxwú7mesh Nation, creates work rooted in Coast Salish design and contemporary cultural resurgence. Lauren's practice explores matriarchal influence and her Japanese-Trinidadian heritage through mixed media and public art.

Sínulhkay is an edition of 50 woodblock relief prints with embossing which illustrates the supernatural story of a double-headed serpent of Skwwwi7mesh legend. Printed by Val Loewen at Malaspina Printmakers.

Proceeds from the sale of this print directly fund the acquisition of *Super Natural Eye II* by KWÍKWI. Featured in the Gordon Smith Gallery's 2025-26 exhibition *From The Ground*, this work will be permanently installed at the new elementary school in North Vancouver's Cloverley neighbourhood in 2026.
