## AFK District Artist in Residence: Tajliya Jamal

Visual artist and illustrator Tajliya Jamal joined AFK as artist-in-residence this winter. AFK worked with Taj to create 4 art activity videos led by the artist. These videos provide hands-on and step by step drawing and bookmaking instruction featuring Tajliya Jamal's creative process. #### Black History Month: Anna Binta Diallo

To mark Black History Month, Artists for Kids is presenting an online resource to share with our community. This fall we were honoured to learn alongside Canadian artist Anna Binta Diallo who joined AFK as an artist-in-residence. We worked with Anna Binta to develop an artist talk and video series now available on the <u>AFK website</u>. This video series provides a curricular resource for elementary and secondary teachers to explore the topics of identity and storytelling with their students. Secondary teachers can carry out a sequence of activities provided in the video series, while elementary educators may adapt the series by viewing the first video, followed by the <u>AFK ArtReach video</u> and <u>lesson plan</u>, entitled <u>Stencils and Storytelling</u>.

Anna Binta Diallo is a multi-disciplinary artist who investigates memory and nostalgia to create unexpected narratives surrounding identity. She is interested in blended identities and in her artwork she has explored her own heritage and life experiences as a French Canadian Black woman born in Senegal. Anna Binta Diallo is currently based in Montreal, or Tio'tia:ke, on the traditional territory of the Kanien'kehá:ka.

#### Young Artist of the Week


