In 1993, four Black creators created <u>Milestone</u> <u>Comics: a new universe of Black Super</u> <u>Heroes</u>, brought to life by Black creators and other artists of color. Milestone didn't just change the way our heroes looked. It built a pipeline for talent who had been excluded and marginalized for too long, and an ecosystem in which Black creativity could thrive. Now, with the relaunch of <u>Milestone Comics</u> and the creation of The Milestone Initiative, we want to honor the creators of Milestone by continuing their mission.

The Navigators Education Programme connects educators and teachers to ideas and resources to engage students Grades 6 to 12 (middle to high school) in learning about the culture, heritage, geography, and diversity of Vancouver's North Shore while offering a unique opportunity for place-based learning. The downloadable guide was developed in consultation with North Shore teachers and educators. Join AFK lead workshop with visual artist, Sarah Khan on February 4th, 2022. Sarah will be working as well with student in our upcoming Secondary Enrichment hosted in March. Join us for a virtual artist talk and Q&A session (on MS Teams) with artist Sara Khan. Come learn about Sara Khan's meticulous watercolour paintings that feature layers, patterning, and rich colours and explore themes that are both autobiographical and surreal. In her talk, Sarah Khan will discuss her artistic process, inspiration, and techniques. Teachers will then have the opportunity to ask questions and to engage in discussion.

Born in England, raised in Pakistan, and now based in Vancouver, Khan creates paintings that explore her relationship to absence and presence and that often feature fantastical, uncanny creatures. Sara Khan holds a BFA (with honours) from National College of Arts, Lahore (2008). Her works have been featured in several national and international group exhibitions. Black History Month: Anna Binta Diallo

To mark Black History Month, Artists for Kids is presenting an online resource to share with our community. This fall we were honoured to learn alongside Canadian artist Anna Binta Diallo who joined AFK as an artist-in-residence. We worked with Anna Binta to develop an artist talk and video series now available on the <u>AFK website</u>. This video series provides a curricular resource for elementary and secondary teachers to explore the topics of identity and storytelling with their students. Secondary teachers can carry out a sequence of activities provided in the video series, while elementary educators may adapt the series by viewing the first video, followed by the <u>AFK ArtReach video</u> and <u>lesson plan</u>, entitled <u>Stencils and Storytelling</u>.

Anna Binta Diallo is a multidisciplinary artist who investigates memory and nostalgia to create unexpected narratives surrounding identity. She is interested in blended identities and in her artwork she has explored her own heritage and life experiences as a French Canadian Black woman born in Senegal. Anna Binta Diallo is currently based in Montreal, or Tio'tia:ke, on the traditional territory of the Kanien'kehá:ka.
