

Gallery Self-Guided Tours

Artists for Kids invites K-12 teacher to use the Gordon Smith Gallery as their classroom, by booking a time to bring a class for a half day self-quided tour.

We will provide two orientation sessions at the Gallery for interested teachers - one in October and one in January. Grade 5 Gallery Program

This fall AFK is excited to launch a blended model for our Grade 5 Gallery Program!

AFK will offer a half-day Gallery Program to ALL grade 5 classes (including split classes) in the school district. Each program, led by AFK art educators, will consist of two parts. Students will first take part in an in-person art workshop in their classroom, creating art inspired by the fall teaching exhibition. This workshop will be followed by a tour of the fall exhibition, either inperson at AFK or in classrooms via MS Teams.

The 2021-2022 Gallery Program will run from the week of September 27, 2021 until the week of February 21, 2022.
