Artist-in-Residence Michael Love

November 3, 6 and 10, 2023 • Grades 10 to 12

We are proud to offer an amazing learning opportunity for secondary students in grades 10, 11 and 12 through our Artist-in-Residence program. During three days, students who are nominated are given the opportunity to work with a professional artist at the AFK Studios. In these workshops, students will consider how photography impacts our relationship to place. With the North Vancouver waterfront as the central location of inquiry, students will first engage with the rich resources at the Museum of North Vancouver Archives to inform their approaches to the site. Students will create original artworks combining location-based photography; scans of historical photographs, maps, and plans; and analogue processes for altering images.

Michael Love received his MFA in photography from Concordia University in 2009.

Love was the co-founder and co-curator of Gallery 295. In addition to his artistic production, Love has also worked as an arts educator at Emily Carr University and the University of the Fraser Valley.

Love has exhibited his work both nationally and internationally. Solo exhibitions have included: Shadow Architecture, Franc Gallery (2019); Between Ideology and Ruin, Franc Gallery (2016); Three Wrongs Don't Make a Right w/ The Everything Co., Access Gallery (2013).
