Dear Boundary Families,

The amount of daylight hours is rapidly diminishing, and the weather has become wet, cold, and stormy at times. If you have an urgent safety concern, please call the main office and we would be happy to discuss, investigate, and respond when we have all information needed. We have learned that most situations involve multiple perspectives and sometimes a misunderstanding or even some misinformation. We also thrive on positive messages as this lets us know when we are doing well.

We thank you all again for helping us keep the Boundary School community a respectful, caring, and inclusive place to play, learn, share, and grow.

To start Waste Reduction Week, we are offering the opportunity for families to drop off any old batteries at the school. The battery collection box is located outside the office.

Drop-Off

As we move into the cooler months, we just wanted to take a moment to remind everyone of the rules regarding parking around our school that help keep all children and adults safe.

The Drop-Off / Pick-Up Zone immediately in front of the school is a no parking zone. This area is designated for dropping off and picking up only. No car should be in the space for more than one minute and no vehicle should ever be parked without a driver. There is a pylon at the end of the zone which indicates the spot to which all cars should pull forward for student drop off and pick up. This courtesy will give other drivers more space and vehicles will not block the staff driveway. Also, please be reminded to not park in, or have children walk through, the staff parking lot before school, during school, or after school. Please be respectful of the rules around the school for the safety of all our children.

Halloween Parade

Our Halloween Primary Parade will be on Friday October 29th. Our plans are to have the Primary Parade outside with a rain plan in place. Unfortunately, like last year, parents will not be able to attend. More details to come.

Mobile Technology

Students who need immediate communication with parents regarding getting to school or home from school may utilize a mobile device before 8:45 or after 3:00 pm on the school grounds.

Students will usually be asked to keep their cell phones in backpacks and not to use them when on the school grounds unless they are working on assignments which may allow the use of this technology. This is always under direct supervision of a staff member.

Please consult with your child's teacher if you have any questions about cell phone use in their classrooms. The school telephone is available for all emergency situations. For any mobile device to be on school property, the parent and student must sign the mobile technology agreement.

Reminders

Appropriate clothing and footwear

Autumn is here and the weather is changing. Please remember to send your children to school in appropriate clothing and footwear to keep them warm and comfortable on these cold and rainy days. Office Reminders

Please complete the student verifications forms and return to the office as soon as possible as this information is very important for student safety. Parents are reminded when dropping off material at the school that items should be clearly labelled with your child's name and division, and that you need to call the office at 604-903-3260 for someone to come outside and meet you.

Health Protocols

Visitors And Item Drop Off

Currently Boundary is not accepting visitors into the school. If you need to speak to a staff member, please organize an appointment through email or call the office at 604-903-3260. If you need to drop something off at the school, or pick something up, please go to the main entrance of the school and call the office. A staff member will be more than happy to connect with you outside. If you are dropping off personal items or clothing for your child, we do require each item to be well labeled with your child's full name and Division. Placing items in a bag is also helpful as we sometimes have many items to deliver to classrooms. Thank you for your understanding.

Masks

<u>All students in grades K to 12</u>, all staff, and visitors with appointments, will be required to wear non-medical masks in all indoor areas of schools, including when they are at work-stations/desks. Students in kindergarten to

grade 3 are now required to wear masks in all indoor areas of a school. Exemptions to the mask requirement are listed HERE (https://bit.ly/2UKMkMv), starting on page 20.

All students should have an a few extra masks in their backpack. The office has a very limited supply for students who forget their mask at home.

Staying Home when Ill and the Daily Health Check.

To reduce the likelihood of coming to a school or a school district site when ill, students, staff and other adults (e.g. visitors) are required to complete a daily health check prior to entering the building. Families and students can use the K-12 Health Check app. Staff and other adults can refer to the BCCDC's When to get tested for COVID-19 document. Staff, students and families can also use the BCCDC online Self-Assessment Tool, call 8-1-1 or their health care provider. As a reminder, students, staff or other adults must stay home when ill or when required by public health to self-isolate
