While I know the North Shore Family Services Christmas Bureau is more than happy to accept any and all types of toys and gifts, we as a PAC were hoping to fill some of the gaps they are experiencing.

Please do not feel any pressure whatsoever as I know the holiday season is a tough time of year, not to mention many people might be turning their efforts and support dollars towards the much-needed relief for the devastating floods we are currently seeing in BC.

Reminders

Drop-Off

With the onset of rougher weather, we have noticed an increase in students being dopped off at school. This year, the staggered drop-off times has alleviated many of traffic pressures we have had in past years. However, this week, we have noticed many traffic infractions that are endangering our students, staff, and Boundary community.

We have noticed:

- Students being dropped off in the staff parking lot
- Students being dropped off in residential driveways
- Vehicles blocking school and residential driveways while students are being dropped off
- Vehicles doing u-turns at the intersection of 26th and Vinedale Road
- Vehicles backing over crosswalks
- Vehicles stopping in front of fire hydrants
- Vehicles parking in drop-off zones

All of these dangerous infractions can easily be avoided with a little pre-planning and a little extra effort. We truly believe that spending a bit more time at drop-off by driving around the block, dropping off a little further

from school and waiting a turn for a drop-off space at the front of the school, we will increase pedestrian safety immensely. When dropping off in front of the school, please pull right up to the sign to allow cars that come in after you a space at the curb. There should be room for 5 or 6 cars at a time. Please make your drop-off short to allow for other vehicles to vehicles to pull into a spot. We appreciate everyone's willingness to support the safety of all the Boundary Community.

Appropriate clothing and footwear

Autumn is here and winter is on its way. Please remember to send your children to school in appropriate clothing and footwear to keep them warm and comfortable on these cold and rainy days. Sending an extra set of clothes to leave at school and a pair of indoor shoes is also suggested to enable them to stay dry and warm even on the wettest of North Van days!

SafeArrival – Student Absence Reporting

This year, all elementary schools in the North Vancouver School District started using SafeArrival, a student absence reporting system, to enhance our existing absence-checking procedures. SafeArrival, which is part of the SchoolMessenger platform, will make it easier for you to report your child's absence (e.g. illness, vacation, appointment), reduce the time it takes school staff to verify student attendance, and makeit more efficient for staff to respond to unreported student absences. Boundary families have found the service extremely helpful and easy to use.

With SafeArrival, you will be able to report your child's absence in advance using any ofthese three options, which are available to you 24 hours/day, 7 days a week:

- 1. **SchoolMessenger app**. Use your mobile device to download the SchoolMessengerapp, available at the Apple App Store, the Google Play Store or <u>go.schoolmessenger.ca</u>.
 - o The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Important: Use the same email address your school has on record.
 - o Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- 2. **SchoolMessenger website**. Open your browser and go to go.schoolmessenger.ca.
 - o The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. <u>Important</u>: Use the same email address your school has on record.
 - o Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- 3. **Automated phone system**. Call the toll-free number 1-833-259-7295 and follow the prompts to report an absence.

SafeArrival Resources:

<u>SchoolMessenger Communicate:</u>

In addition to SafeArrival, schools will use SchoolMessenger Communicate, an automated notification system, also part of the SchoolMessenger platform, to contact you when yourchild is absent and the absence was not reported in advance. The automated notification system will attempt to contact you at multiple contact points until a reason for the absence is submitted. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, school staff will follow up.

The contact points for automated notification for unreported absences are:

- Email/push notifications (SchoolMessenger app). Upon receipt of an email/push notification, you will have five minutes to respond using SafeArrival (app, websiteor toll-free number).
- SMS text message*. If five minutes pass with no response, a SMS text messagewill be sent. You will have five minutes upon receipt of the SMS text message to respond using SafeArrival (app, website or toll-free number).

• Phone call. If five minutes pass with no response, an automated phone call will bemade. Automated phone calls will be sent up to four times and you will be able to respond using SafeArrival (app, website or toll-free number).

Once the automated notification cycle above is complete, you will be unable to respond using SafeArrival, and must contact the school directly regarding the unreported absence.

Please note:

- If you report your child's absence in advance using SafeArrival (app, website or toll-free number), you will NOT receive automated notifications for an unreported absence.
- You can determine the type(s) of notifications you would like to receive by settingyour preferences using the app or website.
- *You must opt in to receive SMS text message notifications (regardless of preference settings). Instructions on how to opt in can be found HERE.
- As an additional layer of security, you may choose to require a 4-digit PIN be entered before an absence can be reported or explained when using the SafeArrival <u>phone</u> system. Refer to page 9 of the <u>Using the SchoolMessenger Appfor SafeArrival guide</u> for more information.
