Dear Boundary Families,

Where is our Spring? These April showers are certainly overstaying their welcome and I think we are all missing some sunshine and warmer temperatures these days. While this has been a great time to over-fill our rain barrels, it has really delayed the direct seed sowing and germination in our gardens and has put a damper on so many outdoor adventures we like to have at this time of year. We acknowledge this with some caution because we know that once the heat shows up, we may be wishing for a cool, rainy day for relief! It is with gratitude that we acknowledge all the gifts of the 4 seasons that we get to experience on these Coast Salish lands.

Our Grade 3 students will spend a full day tomorrow at the Cheakamus Centre participating in the First Peoples Longhouse program, supported by elders and teachers from the Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish) Nation. We are excited for these students as they always return from this program with new knowledge of and appreciation for this land and its Indigenous people and their enduring culture. A reminder to these Grade 3 families that students should arrive at school tomorrow morning, in the undercover area by 7:55 am, prepared for a full day in the weather, as the bus departs at 8:15 am sharp.

Although this rain has hampered some of our Track and Field practice times, all intermediate students continue to train with their classes during PE time. This week we see the first qualification meet in the field events. Only a small number of students have advanced to this level as the criteria is pre-determined by a collaborative District committee. We want to express appreciation to all families and students who have committed to training and showing up to practice in multiple events. This competitive season is short for some, but ongoing physical training and goal setting is a great family activity all year round. Please see more T & F details below.

As always, please continue to keep in touch with your child's classroom teacher if you have any questions about lessons, learning, or your child's progress. It is also important for us know if your family is experiencing any significant changes that may impact your child's learning or emotional resiliency. Often when we have some advance information it helps us support your child in more meaningful ways especially when they need it most. We know that children are under greater stressors these days with family illnesses, employment changes, and many other unexpected changes that can affect the entire family. Woodpecker Problem Solving



Being a woodpecker can't be much fun. You spend your day pounding your head against a tree, and your reward is that you get to eat bugs. What kind of life is that? The pecking is so hard on their heads that woodpeckers actually developed smaller brains than other birds, which might explain why they haven't figured out a better way to feed themselves. Or are there other reasons that woodpeckers engage in this rhythmic, loud activity? Hmmmm.

You have to admire their speed and hard work, though. According to Animals Town, woodpeckers can peck up to 20 times per second! Come to Boundary to observe!!

Math Problems

Wee ones (counting on fingers/hands/pictures)K - Gr 1: If a hungry woodpecker pecks 2 holes, and scoops 6 bugs out of each hole, how many bugs does the woodpecker get to eat?

Little ones Gr 2-3: If a woodpecker pecks a tree 20 times per second, how many times does he peck in 5 seconds? *Bonus*: If a bug pops out after every 10 pecks, how many bugs pop out in those 5 seconds?

Big kids Gr 4-7: If a woodpecker's pecking scares out 1 bug every 5 seconds, how many bugs does he get in 1 minute (60 seconds)? Bonus: If he keeps pecking, how many bugs does he get in 1 hour (60 minutes)?

BONUS FOR EVERYONE (math, science, social studies) – How do we humanely get all of the woodpeckers at Boundary School to move their homes back into the forest where they have lots of room and plenty of bugs to eat!! All creative and humane solutions welcome!

Safe Arrival Pilot Training Student Absence Reporting

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Ensuring students arrive safely at school each day is one of our top priorities.

SafeArrival, which is part of the <u>SchoolMessenger</u> platform, is designed to enhance our existing absence-checking procedures by making it easier for you to report your child's absence (e.g. illness, vacation, appointment), reducing the time it takes school staff to verify student attendance, and making it more efficient for staff to respond to unreported student absences.

With SafeArrival, you will be able to report your child's absence *in advance* using any of these three options, which are available to you 24 hours/day, 7 days a week:

- SchoolMessenger app. Use your mobile device to download and install the SchoolMessenger app, available at the Apple App Store, the Google Play Store or go.schoolmessenger.ca.
 - The first time you use the app, select **Sign Up** to create your account. <u>Important</u>: Use an email address that we have on record for you.
 - Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- SchoolMessenger website. Use the SchoolMessenger website go.schoolmessenger.ca.
 - The first time you use the website, select **Sign Up** to create your account. <u>Important</u>: Use an email address that we have on record for you.
 - Select Attendance, then Report an Absence.
- Automated phone system. Call the toll-free number 1-833-259-7295 and follow the prompts to report an absence.

Note: For absences longer than 3 days, please contact the school directly.

SchoolMessenger Communicate

In addition to SafeArrival, we will pilot **SchoolMessenger Communicate**, an automated notification system, also part of the SchoolMessenger platform, to contact you when your child is absent and *the absence was not*

reported in advance. The automated notification system will attempt to contact you at multiple contact points until a reason for the absence is submitted. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, school staff will follow up.

The contact points for automated notification for unreported absences are:

- Email/push notifications (SchoolMessenger app). Upon receipt of an email/push notification, you will have five minutes to respond using SafeArrival (app, website or toll-free number).
- SMS text message*. If five minutes pass with no response, a SMS text message will be sent. You will have five minutes upon receipt of the SMS text message to respond using SafeArrival (app, website or toll-free number).
- Phone call. If five minutes pass with no response, an automated phone call will be made. Automated phone calls will be sent up to four times and you will be able to respond using SafeArrival (app, website or toll-free number).

Once the automated notification cycle above is complete, you will be unable to respond using SafeArrival, and must contact the school directly regarding the unreported absence.

Please note:

- If you report your child's absence in advance using SafeArrival (app, website or toll-free number), you will NOT receive automated notifications for an unreported absence.
- You can determine the type(s) of notifications you would like to receive by setting your preferences using the app or website.
- *You must *opt in* to receive SMS text message notifications (regardless of preference settings). Instructions on how to opt in can be found <u>HERE</u>.
- As an additional layer of security, you may choose to require a 4-digit PIN be entered before an absence can be reported or explained when using the SafeArrival <u>phone</u> system. Refer to page 9 of the <u>Using the SchoolMessenger App for SafeArrival guide</u> for more information.
