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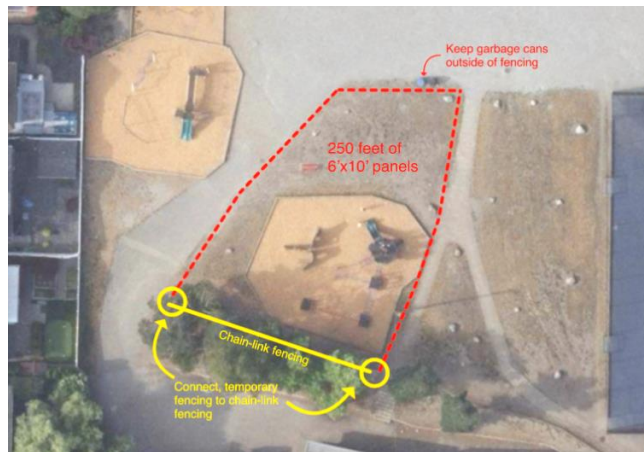
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Dear Boundary Families,

We feel extremely privileged to be at Boundary during the construction of the new, expanded playground. The many months of planning and consultation has now come to fruition! Thank you to PAC and the community for all of their hard work! The construction of the new accessible playground will begin on **Monday, January 20th**.

Below, is a map outlining the location of the new playground and the necessary temporary perimeter fencing around the construction area:

Please note that the **current 'red' playground will be closed** throughout the construction phase, and temporary fencing will be installed on Monday, January 20, 2025, enclosing the playground area site for safety. The construction team is aware that they must stop work when children are outside during recess and lunch. The construction team will not move any machinery outside the fenced area while children are present. Boundary staff are also aware and we will continue to provide opportunities for students to play in other areas of the schoolyard, such as the 'blue' playground, forest, sports court, and field.

Ground preparation and curbing will take some time to cure, and the play equipment is scheduled to arrive in mid-February. The **goal is to have this project completed prior to Spring Break**. Of course, this timeline will depend on the weather and seasonal conditions. Updates will be in the Week Ahead newsletter!
