


Books on: Divorce/Separation

Books that deal with divorce and separation, either by explaining some of the common events associated with this subject, or by providing comfort to children who are finding this situation difficult.




[A Day With Dad](#)

How this book may help: Shows how the love between a child and an estranged parent can remain strong regardless of how far apart they are.




[Mum and Dad Glue](#)

Reinforces the view that the child is not to blame and will continued to be loved as before, and sometimes it is not possible to 'fix' a problem. Explains that parents can sometimes live happily apart.




[No Matter What](#)

How this book may help: May provide reassurance for an insecure or anxious child that their parents' love for them is unconditional and constant, despite the circumstances.




[The Great Big Book of Families](#)

How this book may help: Highlighting the fact that families come in all shapes and sizes, this book celebrates diversity, explaining how every personal situation is different. It's a good book for debunking the traditional storybook myth that happy families usually consist of mother, father and two children. It highlights how different humans are in other ways too, from the hobbies they choose, through to the way they think and what they choose to cook and eat.

The key theme running through the book is that every family is different, and that's OK.




[Space Alien at Planet Dad](#)




[Two Homes](#)

How this book may help: Highlighting that parents can live apart successfully and reassuring children that this situation does not mean that they are loved any less.




[Two of Everything](#)

How this book may help: Providing a starting point to encourage children to talk about divorce and separation. Reassuring them that they are not alone in their experiences, and parents can live happily apart.




[Molly and Her Dad](#)

How this book may help: A touching portrayal of the bonding process between a distant father and his daughter. Although their interaction is awkward at first, love shines through and their similarities become obvious to the reader. As the book progresses, Molly adopts her father's funny expressions and behaviour. Molly's dad lives a 'whole plane ride away' and she hasn't seen him since she was a baby.




[My Dads](#)

How this book may help: This book gives a very positive view of living within a blended family. Both men are very proactive parents and the book shows many positive images of the time they spend with their daughter. A young girl lovingly describes her two fathers, one who she calls Dad and one who she calls Pa. The book does not go into detail on the exact events which led to the girl having two fathers, but the illustrations imply that Dad is the girl's biological father and Pa is her stepfather. She explains that her fathers are very different in many ways, but they both help and support her, and in one very important way they are both exactly the same - they both love her.





This book tells the story of a father who lives separately from his children.




[Dear Daddy](#)

A young girl writes to her father who is absent on board a ship on which he works.




[Was It the Chocolate Pudding - A Story for Little Kids About Divorce](#)

[I Don't Want To Talk About It](#)



A little girl's parents tell her they are getting divorced, but she doesn't want to talk about it. She likens her reactions to different animals such as 'roaring loudly like a lion' so that everyone will think she is brave. The story gives a very positive focus by reassuring the child that none of this is her fault and that both her parents still, and always will, love her.

Worth Noting: Notes to parents at the back may well help parents understand their child's reactions.



How this book may help: A simple and comforting book about separation for very young children






[Little Home Bird](#)
