Code of Conduct and Second Step

We have been supporting our learners' social-emotional, mental, and physical health through various strategies. This has included the school-wide review of our Code of Conduct and implementation of the Second Step program school-wide. We hope that you will be able to use the language we share in our monthly newsletters to support this learning at home. This month, we ask you to review the importance of being Open-Minded.

Capilano ROCKS (**Respectful, Open-Minded, Cooperative, Kind, Safe**): As part of our Code of Conduct, we are Open-Minded. Be Open-Minded by welcoming new ideas and new friendships. You can also be Open-Minded by accepting the feelings, opinions, ideas, and abilities of all and remembering not everybody is the same. Remember to be open-minded Capilano!

Second Step Message: As part of our Code of Conduct, we Care for our Environment. Part of doing that is by being responsible. Being responsible helps make our school a place where everyone can learn. When we're responsible, we can be trusted to do the right thing. We help others. We clean up our messes. We admit when we make mistakes or do the wrong thing. We focus on our schoolwork. We are careful when playing outdoors and being respectful of our environment around us. This month, think about how you can be responsible and do the right thing in class and out at recess.

Highlights from the Summary of Enhanced Health and Safety Guidelines

- ACTION: We kindly request that families consider sending extra masks for their child to keep in their classroom and/or backpack. We find that learners sometimes lose/drop/damage their masks over the course of the day, so having extra masks easily available to them is helpful. Similar to needing an extra change of clothes when wet at school or bringing their water bottle every day, these measures are beneficial to our learning community. We will have masks provided by the school district in the office should a student or staff member require it.
- **IMPORTANT:** If your child is late to school, we ask that you please drop them off at the front door. For the next while, we are requesting that parents/guardians please do not enter the school. There will be a staff member there to walk your child to the office and/or your child's class. If the door is closed and a staff member is not present, please call the office.
- **IMPORTANT:** If your child is needing to be picked-up early from school, we ask that you please wait at the front door and call the office. If you are able to, please provide advanced notice of an early pick-up time via email to ca and your child's classroom teacher. Please Note: as part of ensuring safety for your child, we check to see that the appropriate adult is waiting at the door for early pick-up. However, we cannot support walking a child to the car as this removes staff from the building for longer periods of time and therefore prevents the office team from being able to support others. Thank you for your cooperation!
- **IMPORTANT:** If your child is unwell, a gentle reminder to please let your child's classroom teacher and the school know via <u>capilano@sd44.ca</u> and/or <u>SafeArrivals</u>.
- As per the Superintendent's Update, the North Vancouver School District will "look to use functional closures as a last resort; instead, school and school district leadership would work together to address emerging issues to minimize disruption to in-class learning and transition to online learning, if necessary. It is also important to know that a functional closure would not necessarily impact the entire school (i.e. it may only impact a single class). You can expect us to be in close contact with students, families, and staff and to support those who are impacted by any type of school closure."
- With awareness that the focus for continuity of learning for the remainder of this school year is still <u>in-</u> <u>person instruction</u>, if a functional closure were to occur, we would be using Microsoft Teams (MS Teams) to communicate with our learners during that time. As part of the contingency planning for continuity of learning, classes have been created on MS Teams already to help us transition smoothly should the need arise. Your child should have their MS Teams username and password accessible already as they were used for Student-Family-Teacher Conferences earlier this year.
- ACTION: As part of our efforts to plan for all possibilities regarding the continuity of students' learning, we are considering options to support families who may have limited / no access to technology for their child at home. If this applies to your family, please complete this survey: <u>Technology Survey 2022</u> <u>Planning for</u> <u>Continuity of Learning (Capilano)</u>. The information you provide will help ensure we are prepared to pivot as efficiently as possible should your child's class have to transition to online learning for an amount of time during a functional closure.
- Please help us by avoiding crowding on our school grounds during school hours.

Daily Health Check

- All students and staff are reminded of their responsibility to complete a Daily Health Check prior to entering the building. Helpful Resource: <u>K-12 Health Check App</u>
- All students, staff, and other adults (i.e. visitors) are **MUST** stay home when ill or when required by public health to self-isolate. Helpful resources: BCCDC's <u>When to get tested for COVID-19</u> and BCCDC online <u>Self-Assessment Tool</u> call 8-1-1 or their health care provider.
- As a reminder, students, staff, or other adults must stay home when ill or when required by public health to selfisolate, including when waiting for test results.



Travelling Outside of BC? - From Superintendent's Report (November 25, 2021)

If you travelled over the Winter Break or plan to travel, please take the time to carefully read these Government of Canada resources. The federal government continues to outline requirements for people travelling internationally, including to the United States and Mexico:

- Students, staff and other adults who are *not <u>fully</u> vaccinated* and have travelled outside of Canada *cannot* attend school until a minimum 14 days after arrival, as part of <u>federal requirements</u>.
- **Fully vaccinated** students, staff and other adults who have travelled outside of Canada may qualify for the <u>fully</u> <u>vaccinated traveler exemption</u>. Individuals qualified as fully vaccinated travelers are exempt from quarantine and from Day-8 testing.
- Specific information is also available on the <u>COVID-19 requirements for fully vaccinated travelers and</u> <u>unvaccinated children less than 12 years of age</u> web page.

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Elementary Band & Strings Program



After 60 years, the North Vancouver School District's unique instrumental music program continues to offer students a wonderful opportunity to receive instrumental instruction in a supportive group setting.

Elementary Band and Strings, which complements the Ministry of Education's Arts Education curriculum, is open to students in Grades 5 - 7 for Band and Grades 4 - 7 for Strings.

Involvement in a music program can benefit children's academic and social emotional development, and provides an opportunity to develop a child's musicianship, teamwork and creativity skills (Hallam, S., 2016).

Key Dates

Registration for the 2022-2023 school year runs from **January 10** to **March 4, 2022**.

Program Fees

This program, providing enrichment to the Arts Education curriculum, is funded directly by registration fees.

Payment can be made either as a one-time payment or payment-by-instalment through <u>School Cash Online</u>.

- Registration fees from January 10 to March 4, 2022: \$495 . A payment-by-instalment option is available.
- Late Registration* fees from March 11 to September 30, 2022: \$545. The payment-by-instalment option is **not** available.

The earlier instalment payments begin, the lower the monthly fees. E.g., if you register in January, payments will be approximately \$62 per month (8 instalments). The final instalment date is September 1, 2022.

*Enrolment during Late Registration is subject to program availability and will depend on sufficient registrations received by March 4, 2022.

Program Information 2022-2023

The Elementary Band and Strings program offers students a wonderful opportunity to receive instrumental instruction within an ensemble, and represents the start of an exciting musical journey that they can follow through to the end of their secondary school years.

Classes are scheduled twice a week before or during school time and a preliminary schedule will be available in early June 2022. Students should be prepared to commit to attending all classes, rehearsals and concerts.

This program has been made possible through the direct support of a large number of dedicated parents/guardians, staff and administrators, and specifically, the NVSD Band and Strings Parent Association.

About the Band Program

Beginning Band is available to students in Grades 5 through 7 who are new to the Band Program.

Continuing Band is offered to students in Grade 6 through 7 who have played their instrument for at least one year.

Band programs will be offered at many of our schools*. Programs offered at each school will only run if there is sufficient enrolment received by March 4, 2022. If you have registered your child for a program that is unable to run due to low enrolment, you will receive a full refund.

*The following schools will not be offering registration for a band program for the 2022-2023 school year: Larson, Montroyal and Norgate.

About the Strings Program

Beginning Strings is available to students in Grades 4 to 7 who are new to the Strings Program.

Continuing Strings is available to students in Grades 5 to 7 who have played their instrument for at least one year.

The NVSD will be offering a strings program at Braemar, Canyon Heights, Cleveland, Dorothy Lynas, Highlands, Larson, Montroyal and Ross Road.

Instruments

Students will need to rent (or purchase) an instrument and purchase a method book. A limited number of instruments are available through the school district's instrument rental program (user fee of \$100 or \$150, plus \$100 deposit). You may also choose to rent or purchase from local music stores. Information will be provided by the school's Band or Strings teacher.

Registration (Key Dates)

January 10 to March 4

- Fee: \$495
- Payment options: a one-time payment or paymentby-instalment through <u>School Cash Online</u>.

March 11 to September 30 (Late registration*)

- Fee: \$545
- Payment option: a one-time payment through <u>School</u> <u>Cash Online</u> (no payment-by-instalment)

*Enrolment during Late Registration is subject to program availability and will depend on sufficient registrations received by March 4, 2022.

Withdrawals & Refunds

All requests for refunds must be made in writing by completing a withdrawal form and submitting it to your child's school office. **Full refunds will be processed until June 15, 2022.** After June 15, a \$75 non-refundable processing fee will be charged. No refunds will be issued after September 30, 2022.

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
