Message to Capilano Families

We have started the 2023-2024 school year with a return to many fun and engaging learning opportunities! This has included the successful PAC Welcome Back Mingle and Curriculum Night. It was great to see so many faces back at the school again. We were excited to get our students together for the Terry Fox and Nancy Leith Run – thank you for your donations to the Terry Fox Foundation! Our learning continued as we explored Truth and Reconciliation and came together for a successful Orange Shirt Day assembly where we discussed how we can continue to take action towards truth, healing, and reconciliation.

We are also continuing with initiatives that we started last year, including the Multi-Age Groups and Student of the Week. The Multi-Age Groups enables children to create connections with other students from K-7 and other staff in the building while we engage in school-wide learning activities. We will have our first Multi-Age Group activity for this school year by sharing lunch together within our colour groups. Please see below for more information. 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Foundation Skills Assessment

As per the recent Superintendent's Report, grade 4 and grade 7 students are participating in the Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA). The FSA is an annual province-wide assessment of students' academic skills and provides a snapshot of students' foundational skills in literacy and numeracy. All students in grades 4 and 7 are required by the Ministry of Education to write the FSA. The FSA will be administered at schools between October 3 and October 27, 2023. Your child's classroom teacher should have shared a schedule of the FSA.

Halloween

For those wearing costumes to school, we encourage learners to wear costumes that do NOT include blood/gore that is inappropriate, weapons, masks that fully cover their face (it should be that which can be removed to learn/at recess/at lunch/for safety reasons) and anything else that would be deemed inappropriate for school. A school-wide primary parade will take place. Please do not send treats for your child to share with others at school and consider health alternatives when packing their snacks. Any additional events taking place in individual classrooms will be shared by your child's classroom teacher. At their discretion, similar to birthdays, if food will be involved in the event, it is recommended that only pre-packaged, individually wrapped food is sent with consideration to allergies in the class (nut-aware) and healthy options.

Birthday Celebrations

We encourage families to consider planning birthday celebrations, including taking photos and sharing goodies with other children, outside of school hours. If you must send a treat to share with the class, please ensure they are prepackaged, individually wrapped food with consideration to allergies in the class (nut-aware) and healthy options.

Pokémon

Please do not send Pokémon cards to school. With the awareness of challenges that have arisen in the past from students playing with Pokémon cards during recess and lunch. To help us respect our Capilano R.O.C.K.S. Code of Conduct and support students in making good choices, we will **not be able to have Pokémon** cards at school. Further, we encourage students to leave all valuables and special items at home.

General Reminders

Visitors/guests/volunteers to the building should be pre-arranged and sign-in at the front office to ensure they have appropriate visitor tags, otherwise we appreciate that individuals not be on the school property during the school day. Also, a reminder to please avoid bringing your dog onto the school property. To help ensure the safety of learners and staff, dogs are not allowed on the school grounds, especially during school hours between 8:00 – 3:30.

Kindergarten Information Session - October 11

A Kindergarten information session for parents/guardians of children who will enter Kindergarten in September 2024 will be held in person on Wednesday, October 11 at Argyle Secondary School. Doors open at 6:30pm and the presentation is at 7:00pm. Families will gain a deeper understanding of the school district, including what they can expect as their child enters the school system. 2024/2025 Kindergarten – Registration begins October 12

Registration for priority placement for 2024/2025 Kindergarten (children born in 2019) begins on October 12 and continues until December 15. Please note: Registrations of children at any age level, including Kindergarten, do NOT take place at the school.

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Dear Capilano Elementary Parents and Guardians:

<u>Subject: Emergency "Lockdown" Procedure and Practice Drill – October 13th at 11:45am</u>

The North Vancouver School District, in partnership with the North Vancouver R.C.M.P., has recently undertaken an annual review of our emergency lockdown procedures. Between September 20 and October 19, 2023, all schools in the NVSD will be conducting a practice lockdown drill, which will include the participation of all students and staff. **At Capilano Elementary**, we will be conducting our lockdown drill on **Friday, October 13 at 11:45am**.

In preparing this communication, I realize that even the mention of the word "lockdown" can introduce unwelcome thoughts and raise questions and concerns. On page 2 of this letter, please find a series of Questions & Answers to further explain what a "lockdown" means and our procedures for addressing this scenario, however unlikely, in our schools.

We realize that an actual lockdown scenario is intensely stressful for everyone involved. One of the most common reactions in parents is reaching their child by cellphone. However, as is explained in the Q & A, cellphone communication can put individuals who find themselves in a lockdown situation at greater risk. For this reason, we ask all parents for their cooperation in respecting the law enforcement directive prohibiting the use of cellphones by staff and students during a lockdown.

Both the North Vancouver School District, and our school, always recognize our collective responsibility for the safety of students and staff on our premises. While the likelihood of threatening behaviours/incidents in our schools is very, very low, we hope you will find this knowledge of our procedures to be reassuring. Please don't hesitate to discuss this information with me here at the school. "Lockdown" Procedure and Practice Drills - Questions & Answers



What is a "school lockdown"?

A lockdown is an emergency procedure designed to protect occupants from an external harm, or contain the movement of occupants when a danger is present in, or around, the building. In a school lockdown, only emergency response teams from law enforcement will enter the school. A "lockdown" means that people must stay where they are and cannot leave until escorted outside by response personnel.

Are there different procedures depending upon the situation?

Yes. There are three different distinctions of "lockdown" that direct how a situation will beaddressed:

Level 1 "LOCKDOWN" – The danger is present inside the school. Level 2 "HOLD AND SECURE" – The danger is close to, but not inside the building Level 3 "SHELTER IN PLACE" – A risk is in the surrounding area.

How are school staff prepared to handle a lockdown situation?

School-based staff are trained in how to recognize and respond to all three lockdown scenarios.

Why do children have to practice a lockdown drill? Isn't that creating a stressful situation?

Particularly in emergency situations, we are all more confident, less anxious, and better able to cope whenwe know there is a plan in place. An essential part of the lockdown drill in our schools is for staff to lead conversations about the experience afterwards to reassure students and help them develop new coping and self-calming techniques for the future.

May I communicate with my child during a lockdown?

It's expected that many parents will feel an urgent need to contact their child in a lockdown situation. However, any sound from a cellphone can alert the danger/intruder to the presence of an individual or group, placing them, and everyone in their vicinity, at greater risk. For this reason, students and staff are not permitted to use cellphones during a lockdown situation.

Communications both in and out of a school under lockdown are restricted to law enforcement personneland their designates—including school principals and school district senior administrators.

During a school lockdown, where can I learn more information?

Recognizing that telephone reception could quickly become overwhelmed by a high volume of calls in a lockdown situation, the School District will update its website as information is released to us through the R.C.M.P..
