#### **Foundation Skills Assessment**

As per the recent Superintendent's Report, grade 4 and grade 7 students are participating in the Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA). The FSA is an annual province-wide assessment of students' academic skills and provides a snapshot of students' foundational skills in literacy and numeracy. All students in grades 4 and 7 are required by the Ministry of Education to write the FSA. The FSA will be administered at schools between October 4 and October 29, 2021.

#### Safety Reminders for the Capilano Community

In conversation with the PAC and parents from our community, we would like to send a few safety and environmental stewardship reminders for our neighbourhood. We are also discussing these topics at school through morning announcements and in-class discussions. The first reminder is related to masks. We are asking students, staff, and families to dispose of their masks in a safe manner – rather than dropping them on the ground when playing outdoors, we remind everyone to appropriately dispose of their individual mask. The second reminder is related to hypodermic needles. Some of our families in the neighbourhood have found some hypodermic needles in their backyard. We are going to talk to learners about not picking up sharp objects and being careful if they see needles on the ground, including getting adult help. Our Educational Assistant team and Custodial team is also keeping an eye on our school grounds. However, it might be helpful to also review safety information related to needles with your child at home. Thank you for helping keep our community safe and acting as environmental stewards!

- Kindergarten to Grade 7 Students and Adults are reminded to wear a mask
- Please help us by avoiding crowding on our school grounds during school hours
- A friendly reminder to please **supervise** any children you may be responsible for before school (during drop-off) or after school (during pick-up) while on school grounds.
- Visitors to Capilano Elementary should be limited and must make an appointment in advance if it is absolutely necessary to be inside of the school. Parent Volunteers are not permitted at this time.
  - o If any adult does enter the building, they should use the front Visitor Door and report to the Office.

This past month and during Truth and Reconciliation week, learners and staff have been engaged in understanding more about our past and how to move forward together. Early this school year, we started with the raising of the *Every Child Matters* flag. Our vice-principal, Ms. Stephanie Maki, led a workshop for staff on Orange Shirt Faceless Dolls (with permission from NWAC) which was then shared with learners in a variety of classrooms by the educators. Please see the display boards created with the student and staff artwork. As well, we were fortunate in having an elder virtually join us for the Orange Shirt Day assembly which focused on his lived experiences with the Indian Day School and Indian Residential School System. We have been spending time deepening our IB Learner Profile attributes as we expand on our understanding of Truth and take steps toward Healing and Reconciliation.



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
