School Plan Update

We continue to work on our school plan goal of improving the well-being of of our students, staff and community. Code of Conduct - We are Capilano

Last spring, the NVSD launched our new District Code of Conduct for all students from K-12, staff, and families. This document is our overarching Code of Conduct, and throughout this past year, we have been working on how we will contextualize this to Capilano.

We are excited to launch our new Capilano way of being - "We are Capilano."

This will be replacing "Capilano ROCKS." "We are Capilano" is directly connected to our IB PYP Learner Profile. While there are 10 different Learner Profile attributes, our team decided that it really comes down to four of them - open-minded, caring, principled and reflective. These four Learner Profiles capture who we want to be here at school.

Student voice has been front and center in this development process and members of the Student Leadership Team helped us to define what each of these attributes look like in our school. The upper intermediate classes have also been contributing and will be involved in helping us move forward with this.

Starting after Spring Break, we will be launching this with the students. Teachers will be sharing the expectations with classes and doing some direct teaching about them. We will also be doing some fun activities throughout the school to get started with this and to help build the momentum.

Anti-Racism Work

Thank you to Chantelle Nascimento for leading a very informative Zoom session for parents and staff on the topic of anti-racism and how to support our community with this. Some key take-aways from this presentation included: understanding words have history and can be used as weapons, being aware of your biases, encouraging active bystanding, being aware of what our children are doing online, and modeling anti-racist/anti-discriminatory behaviour.

Our Grades 4-7 classes also participated in presentations on this topic from Get REAL, a Canadian non-profit focused on combatting 2SLGBTQ+ discrimination, racism, and bullying in schools, summer camps, and workplaces.

Student Leadership Team

Our Student Leadership Team has been busy this term. Not only did they lead our Pink Shirt Day assembly, but they also recently had the opportunity to connect with the Student Leaders from Carson Graham.
