Preparing for the Year Ahead

School Opening (more details)

On Tuesday, September 5, school will be in session from 9:00 – 11:00 am. Our entrance bell will ring at 8:55 am. Upon entrance, students should proceed to their last year's classrooms. New students report to the library on Tuesday.

Wednesday, September 6 is our first full day. Please remember, however, that as it is a Wednesday and we dismiss at 2:15 p.m. When students enter at 8:45 a.m. they should report to rooms as follows:

2017-18 Grade Report to...

- Kindergarten Classrooms specified on letter sent home
- Grade 1 Library *
- Grades 2 to 7 Classrooms you were in yesterday
- * Parents of Grade I students, please note this change from yesterday. Please help your children find their way to the library on Wednesday morning, NOT their last year's kindergarten classrooms. They will be greeted by staff members in the library, and will be helped to their new Grade I classrooms from there. Older students and staff members will help the Grade I students ensure they get their belongings to their new classrooms.

Students who are new to Capilano will be assigned to a classroom for Wednesday morning, where they will meet up with students in their own grade. This will be done Tuesday morning.

Parents, after helping your children to the above mentioned locations, we ask that you make your way outside the building. While we want you to feel welcome in the school, your presence outside your child's classroom on this first day can cause or increase worry. Thank you for helping us build resiliency and a sense of independence in your child.

We ask that students on Wednesday have all school supplies, snacks, a lunch, water bottle and appropriate clothing for the weather.

School Organization

Capilano will continue to be organized in twenty classes (divisions). We expect approximately 450 students in kindergarten to grade 7. We expect to have students in their classes by 10:00 am on Wednesday, September 6, 2017.

Capilano staff have spent a great deal of time considering placements in the context of individual students' needs, our school's organization and priorities for balancing class compositions. Our task is not an easy one. Children often need encouragement when adjusting to a new classroom placement, and we appreciate your support in assisting with this process.

Health Matters!

We encourage families to walk or bike to and from school as often as possible. In addition to its physical benefits, being active outdoors prior to school helps children be alert and prepared to learn. Fewer students arriving by car also improves air quality around the school.

Please ensure children come to school with <u>healthy snacks</u>, <u>drinks and lunches</u>. Having balanced food selections to choose from throughout the day helps children maintain energy and focus. We also ask that parents send children to school with a water bottle so they can stay hydrated throughout the day. Thank you for considering the environment when packing snacks and lunches by aiming for a litter-free lunch as often as possible.

While many are excited to start a new school year, getting back into school routines can be challenging for children (and adults) of all ages. Suggested routines include: reading before bed, consistent bedtimes,

packing lunches and organizing backpacks. Settling in to the new school year will take time as students adjust to new classmates, classrooms and teachers.

Every day is an outside day at Capilano! Please ensure children have at school clothing to keep them comfortable throughout the school day. Raincoats, rubber boots and umbrellas are also recommended given our climate. Having a small bag of extra clothing at school is a good idea too.

Traffic

On days you are not able to walk or bike to school, please abide by all driving laws and posted signage. If choosing to use our pick-up/drop-off zone please travel west on 20th street, follow volunteer traffic marshals' signals, and please do not park in this zone. If able to assist with traffic monitoring, please sign up on the CPAC volunteer board or visit the CPAC website to sign up.

Before & After School Supervision

Parents are responsible for supervising children on school grounds before and after school, unless a staff member has taken responsibility for supervision (ex. tutorials, extra-curricular activities). Please do not leave children on school grounds without direct supervision of a responsible adult.
