#### Winter Weather and Capilano Snow Volunteers

We did amazingly well with fundraising this school year during the Scholastic Book Fair. Thank you to those families who volunteered their time or visited the Book Fair. Ms. Farrell is so proud that we were able to exceed our sales from last year and is looking forward to using some of the Scholastic credits to purchase books and resources for the school. A giant THANK YOU to Ms. Farrell for her hard work, time, and dedication in making the Scholastic Book Fair a success!

#### Gradually Shifting Student Entry into Capilano

Due to post-pandemic effects and other such social-emotional factors, the staff had identified that students seemed to be needing support entering the building last year. As such, we started this school year with line-ups to actively support our learners to enter the building in a calm and respectful manner. Lining up on the gravel field has supported staff being able to connect with children and support the teaching of walking into the building in an appropriate way. The staff's goal was to ensure this teaching was in place before supporting students in being able to do this independently by gradually releasing the need for lining up. At this time, the staff are hoping to trial this by providing the opportunity for students to independently enter the building during recess and lunch (aside from the Kindergarten process which has always been the same due to many reasons). We will continue to use specific doors for grade groups to enter the building to help with streamlining the flow; there has been a slight shift for Grade 6s to use Door B and Grade 7s to use the Front Door. Based on how the next two weeks proceed, more information will be provided to students and families in early January as to how we will be proceeding with entering the building for the remainder of the school year. For now, during morning drop-off, students will continue to line-up at their Division sign in the morning and staff will continue to meet them there to enter the building.

#### **Capilano School Plan**

As part of our School Plan, we continue to work on our school goal which is alignment with our <u>NVSD Strategic Plan</u>. **Goal: Enhancing our Sense of Community through Compassionate Integrity** – By supporting our community's social and emotional well-being and our sense of belonging at Capilano, through mindfulness of:

We have been focusing our professional development, practices, actions, teaching, and learning at Capilano to be in alignment with our School Plan goals. We have some innovative learning planned for staff for the upcoming months and are eager to implement the new learning into our daily teaching practice as we continue to move forward together!

#### **Gratitude Challenge**

As always, we are finding ways to express gratitude to show acts of kindness and to spread happiness. Similar to last year, we will share daily challenges for acts of gratitude with our learning community. Students, staff, and families are welcome to partake in the daily challenges. #### Code of Conduct and Second Step

We have been supporting our learners social-emotional, mental, and physical health through various strategies. This has included the school-wide review of our Code of Conduct and implementation of the school-wide Second Step program. We hope that you will be able to use the language we share in our monthly newsletters to support this learning at home. This month, we ask you to review the importance of being respectful.

As part of our Code of Conduct - Capilano ROCKS (Respectful, Open-Minded, Cooperative, Kind, Safe): As part of our Code of Conduct, we are Respectful. We respect others by using encouraging words and remembering to respect personal space. We respect the environment by leaving it the way it is and by putting litter in the appropriate bins. And, with winter weather, we remember to be respectful of other's snow creations. We continue to ask our learners to be safe when making choices outdoors. When we act in safe ways, we keep our bodies to ourselves. This month, we encourage our learners to think about how we can act and speak with respect in the classroom, hallway, and when playing outdoors.

**Second Step Message:** Being respectful helps everyone feel like they are in a welcome and safe learning community. When we act respectfully, we listen carefully to each other, help each other, and try to understand how someone else feels. When we speak respectfully, we use friendly words and say please and thank you. We don't call other people names. This month, we encourage our learning community take time to greet others and invite them to play.

#### IB Learner Profile – December's Focus: Thinker

As part of Capilano's School Plan, we are also focusing on enhancing our sense of community through compassionate integrity by supporting our community's social and emotional well-being and our sense of belonging at Capilano. To support this goal, we are hoping to collaborate using our home-school partnership to discuss different important topics in a mindful manner. Over the year, we will focus on one aspect of the IB Learner Profile monthly; the month's focus will be launched by Mr. Kaboli (our IB Coordinator) and Mrs. Farrell (our Teacher-Librarian) during LIVE with Mrs. Farrell. We are hoping that the completion of the Capilano Learner Profile Reflection will encourage these important conversations at home, thereby reinforcing the learning taking place at school.
