Lisa Gelobter is a pioneer of many internet technologies whose ambition and hard work has led her to become involved in the transformation of the computer and internet. Born in 1971 to a Polish father who survived the Holocaust and an African Caribbean mother, Lisa earned her degree in computer science at Brown University. Her website states, “She[Lisa] brings consumer focus and transformative practice to technology, media and the social sector.”

Lisa is credited with being the creative force behind Shockwave, the flash animation technology that allows for the creation of GIFs, the animation for video games and the sharing of video files online, in texts and Tweets.

Lisa was also in the team that started the streaming service, HULU. She was also the Director for the Black Entertainment Digital Network and the Chief Digital Service Officer with the US Department of Education, working from the White House, during the Obama administration. Currently, Lisa is the co-founder and CEO of tEquitable, a website and APP whose goal is to make companies more diverse and inclusive. She is also a proud supporter of STEM programs. Black History.
