

MATH FLOW CHART



- French is one of Canada's official languages so beneficial to know, especially if you move east.





WEX CO-OP

- Co-Op is an expanded version of Work Experience
- For students who are very interested in trades which are difficult to find in regular afternoon Work Experience classes.
- Examples Electrical, Hairdressing, HVAC, Locksmith, Carpentry, Welding
- For students interested in getting experience for employment after graduation.
- Attend Carson on Day 1 then go to a work placements on Day 2.
- Includes CLC with enhanced Financial and Business components.
- Earn 12 elective credits for graduation.







YOUTH WORK IN TRADES

- Youth Work in Trades is for students hired as an apprentice in a trade.
- Students attend school Day1 and work as a paid apprentice on Day 2.
- Students in Youth Work in Trades can earn 16 elective credits, earn money and earn hours towards their Red Seal trade certification.
- An employer must be arranged before a student can pursue this option.

STUDY BLOCKS IN GRADE 12

- All Grade 12 students must take a <u>minimum</u> of 7 courses (<u>6 on timetable</u> courses and CLC 12 which is offered off timetable, through Teams online).
- When you choose your courses this month, please do so purposefully.
- Before you choose your courses, consider what extracurricular activities you will be involved in next year: Will work, sports, volunteering, and family duties take up a lot of your time? Avoid over &/or under loading yourself in Grade 12.
- Research NOW which courses you will need for post secondary applications.
- Changes to your schedule will be very difficult to accommodate in September: We cannot guarantee changes can be made!

COURSE CHANGE REQUEST PROCESS IN SEPTEMBER

- 1. Students will first need to discuss the course change request with their parent/guardian to get their permission
- 2. They will then scan the QR code and complete the request form
- Once they have completed the online form they have entered a virtual line/queue
- 4. Please do not phone or email the school as this inhibits our ability to work through the virtual line
- 5. Counsellors will communicate with students regarding changes through Teams.

 *IMPORTANT Requirements can change at ANY time: it is YOUR responsibility to inform yourself of the most up to date admission requirements.

Course Programming Process

- CAREFULLY complete course programming form
- Parent/guardian **MUST** review course requests
- Feb 7 13: help and computers in the agora 8:30 9:10 am
- Jan 24 Feb 1: <u>Students</u> ENTER COURSES INTO MYED BC
- Feb 13th at the latest, forms are due to main office
- Your counsellor will review forms and requests in MyEd. (Courses in MyEd <u>MUST</u> match what is on the form, will default to form)

Important to note

- Changes after courses have been entered this spring must be made through communication by a parent/guardian (email) to Ms. McKay
- Later changes will be more difficult to accommodate due to timetable constraints.
- Course requests are not guaranteed
- Timetables are subject to change through late August to early September.
