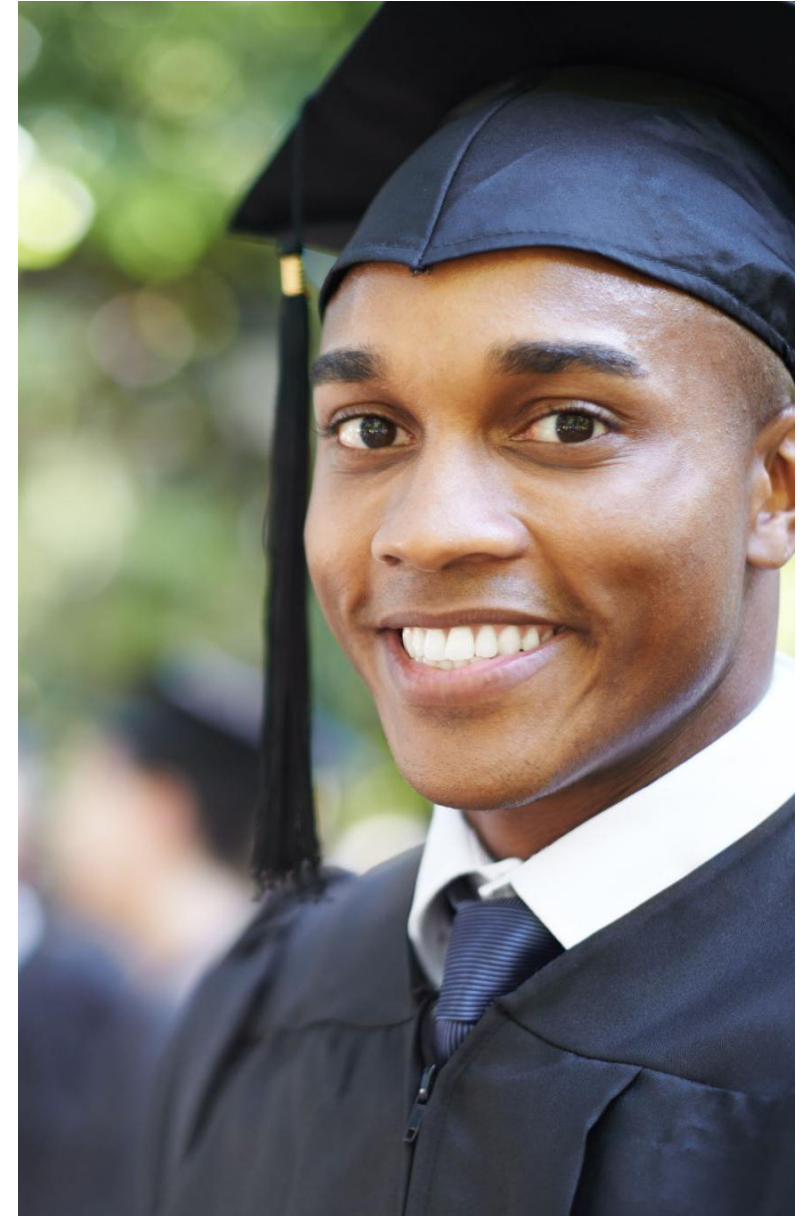

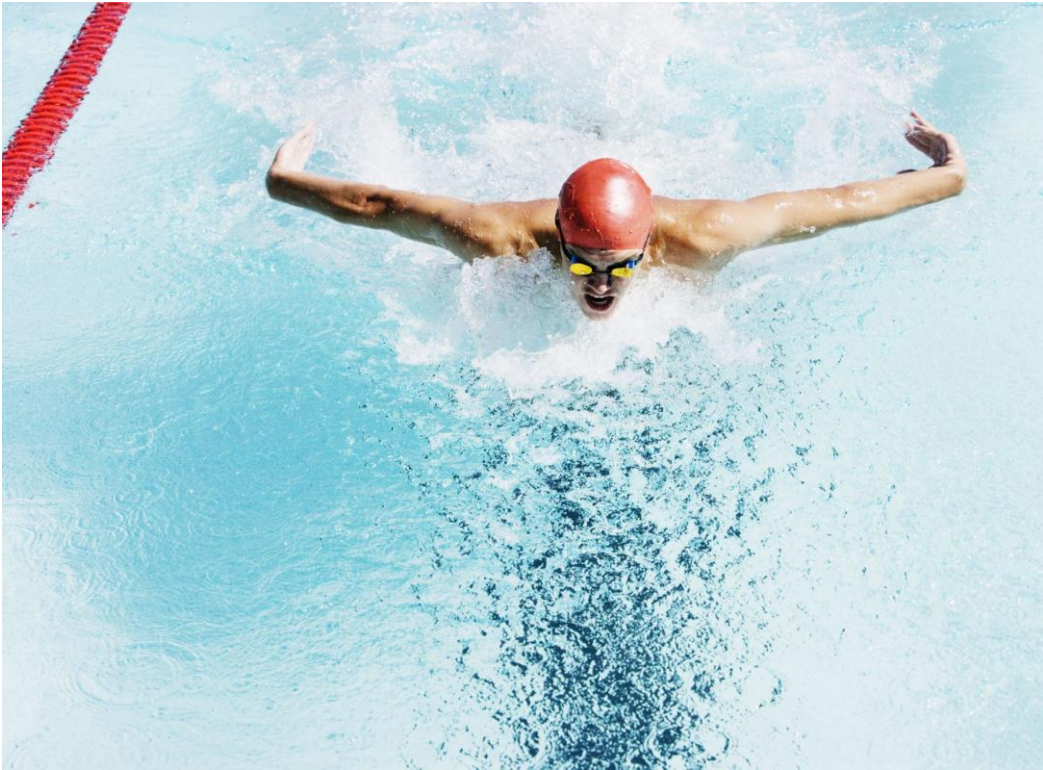

IMPORTANT!

POST SECONDARY INSTITUTION REQUIREMENTS

- Meeting graduation requirements does not equal meeting Post Secondary Institution (PSI) requirements
- Every PSI has its own requirements, and each faculty (department) has its own requirements

*Requirements can change at any time: it is the students/families responsibility to keep informed of the most up to date admission requirements.



UNIVERSITY BOUND?

Two possible routes to your educational goal

1. The Direct Route: enter directly into desired post-secondary institution from high school
2. The Transfer Route: start at one institution, then transfer to another post-secondary institution into 2nd or 3rd year and take your credits with you.

Same degree at the end!

POST SECONDARY REQUIREMENTS

- University transfer credits may be possible

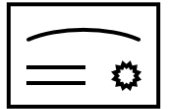
Carson students have the option of Full DP or Partial DP


