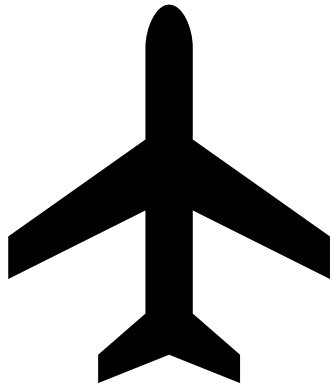
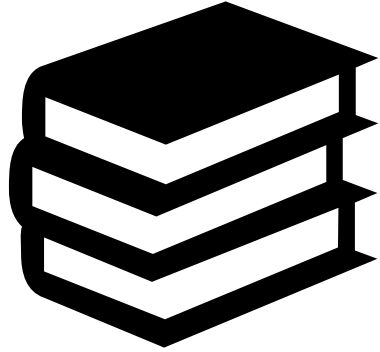
WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CHILD DOES NOT MEET THE GRADUATIONS REQUIREMENTS BY JUNE 2027?

- If they are in good standing at the school, they will still be involved in graduation events and will cross the stage during the graduation ceremony

- Next Steps:

If they choose to, they can continue their education:

- At North Vancouver Summer Learning 2027 (can take one course if it is required for graduation and they are not yet 19 years of age)
- Through Adult Basic Education offered through NVOL, Capilano University, BCIT, Langara College, Douglas College, Vancouver Community College
- Possible direct entry into a post secondary program at BCIT, Langara College or Douglas College (check requirements on websites)

RE-CAP NOTES ON POST SECONDARY INSTITUTIONS (PSI)

- Meeting graduation requirements does not equal meeting Post Secondary Institution requirements
- Every PSI and faculty (department) have their own requirements
 - ***IMPORTANT** Requirements can change at ANY time: it is the student's responsibility to inform themselves of the most up to date admission requirements.

UNIVERSITY BOUND?

2 WAYS TO OBTAIN THE SAME DEGREE

The Direct Route

- Enter directly into desired post-secondary institution from high school

The Transfer Route

- Start at one institution, then transfer to another post-secondary institution into 2nd or 3rd year and take your credits with you.

STUDENTS WHO ARE READY TO GO STRAIGHT TO UNIVERSITY:

1. Can demonstrate strong academic readiness (strong reading, writing and study skills)
2. Can demonstrate a high level of independence
 - manage their time, sleep and workload
 - can complete and hand assignments in on time
 - can seek help when needed
3. Are internally motivated and can persist through non-preferred tasks
4. Can demonstrate emotional and mental readiness – handle stress, setbacks and feedback in a healthy way
5. Have a clear academic path
6. If moving away for school, they need to have strong basic life skills (financial management, cooking, laundry, booking medical appointments etc)



SMALLER SCHOOLS WITH UNIVERSITY TRANSFER OPTION AND ACADEMIC UPGRADING

Capilano University

- A minimum grade point average of 2.0 (60%) calculated on English Studies 12 and two academic Grade 12 courses (General Admission)
- Specific program requirements will vary

Other schools require grade 12 graduation

- Douglas College
- Kwantlen Polytechnic School
- Langara College
- Vancouver Community College
- BCIT (some programs require grade 10 completion)

OR enter into Adult Basic Education to complete graduation requirements and then move into the program of choice

OR some programs offer flexible admission processes for students 19 years or older who have not met graduation requirements.

BENEFITS OF STARTING AT A SMALLER SCHOOL

- Smaller class sizes (15-30 students)
- More one on one time with instructors
- Hands on experiences and research opportunities
- More lab time at some institutions
- Smoother transition into University – many students achieve higher marks and do better overall
- Less expensive
- Many instructors are direct from the field so there is the opportunity to build contacts and network

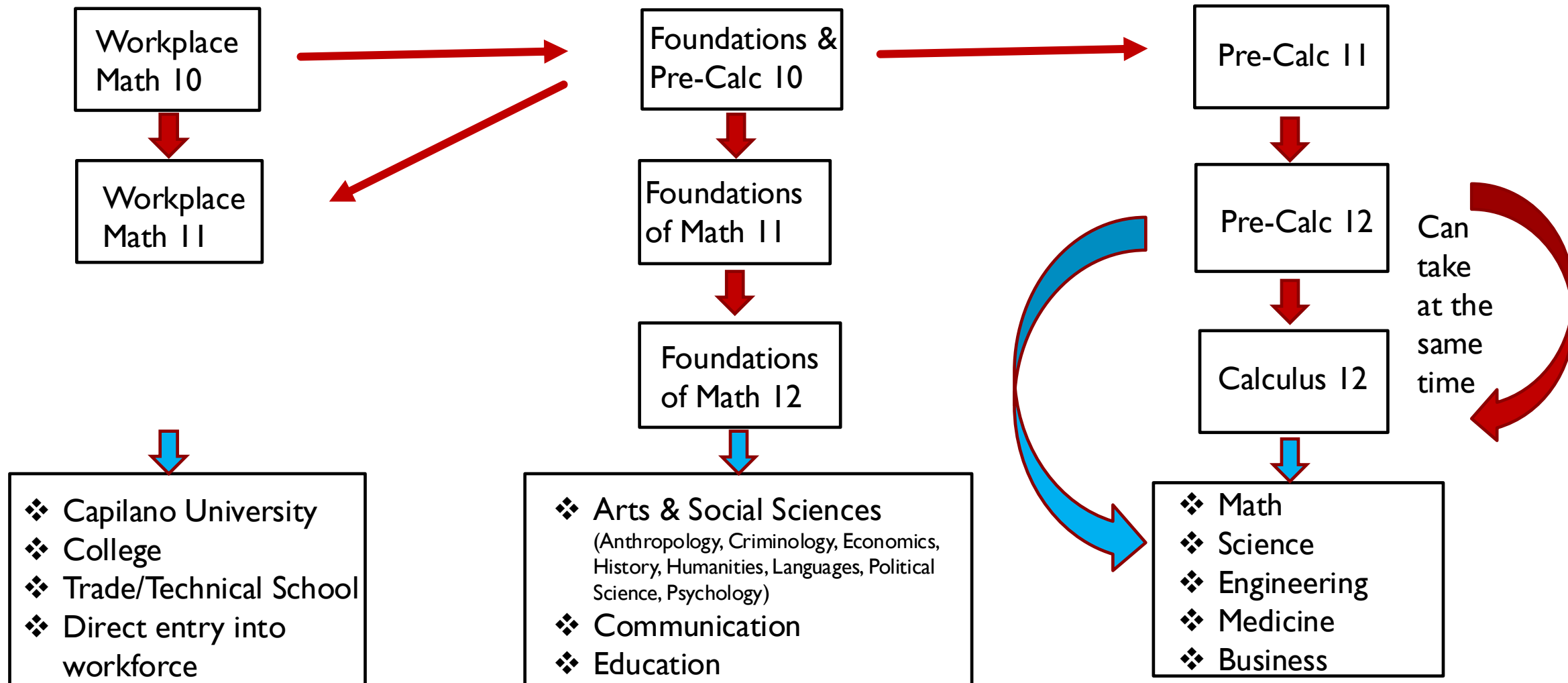

WEX CO-OP



- Co-Op is an expanded version of Work Experience
- For students who are very interested in trades which are difficult to find in regular afternoon Work Experience classes.
- Examples from this year - Electrical, Fishing Industry, Tree Trimming Business, Carpentry, Welding, Plumbing, Auto Mechanics
- For students interested in getting experience for employment after graduation.
- Attend Carson on Day 2's and then go to a work placements on Day 1's.
- Includes CLC with enhanced Financial and Business components.
- Earn 12 elective credits for graduation.

YOUTH WORK IN TRADES

- Youth Work in Trades is for students hired as an apprentice in a trade.
- Students attend school Day 1 and work as a paid apprentice on Day 2.
- Students in Youth Work in Trades can earn 16 elective credits, earn money and earn hours towards their Red Seal trade certification.
- Could be eligible for \$1000 scholarship if 900 work hours are recorded with Skill Trades BC by employer



STUDY BLOCKS IN GRADE 12

- All Grade 12 students must take a minimum of 7 courses
- CLC 12 which is offered off timetable (through Teams online) will give students a study block in your timetable. This counts as 1 of the 7 courses.
- Students may choose either a 2nd study block OR an LAC class (if currently registered in LAC)
- Before choosing courses, students should consider what extracurricular activities they will be involved in next year: Will work, sports, volunteering, and family duties take up a lot of time? Help them choose a course load that they can manage independently.

MY STUDENT WOULD BENEFIT FROM 2 STUDY BLOCKS...

- If they have a heavy academic load
- If they will utilize their time well
- If they have a very busy workload outside of school (job/volunteer/sports/family commitments)

Remember that this is the last time students will have the opportunity to take a course for free, so why not try something new if they do not truly need a second study block.

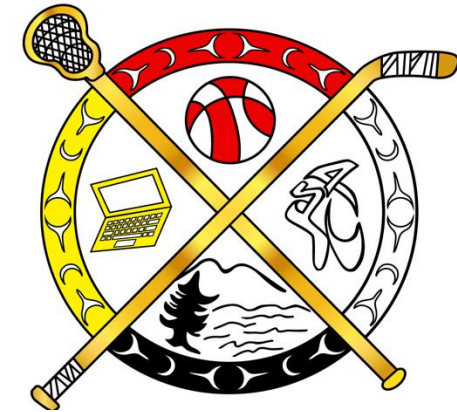

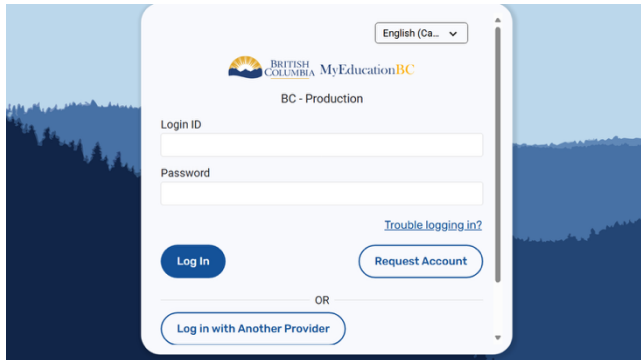

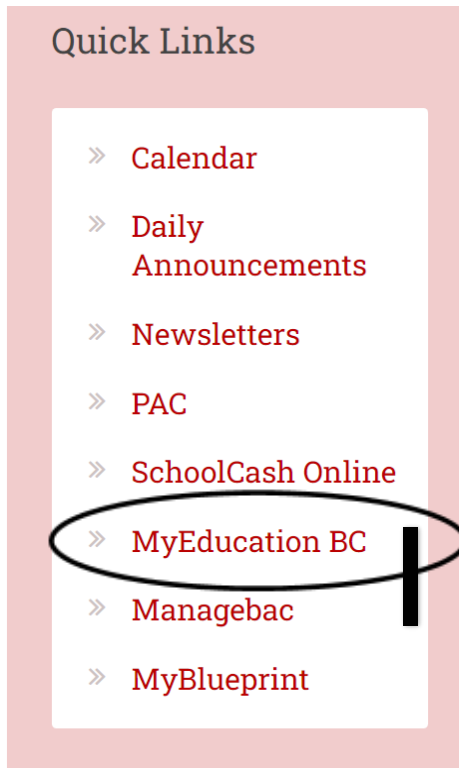
