 - Register for an online course during the 2024-2025 school year (check with universities regarding deadlines for course completion)



- Typically, no credit for Peak Performance
- Notify your counsellor as soon as possible if you plan to apply
- Minimum of 15 hours per week of specific training in their ONE discipline year-round, minimum C+ average



A FEW NOTES ON POST SECONDARY INSTITUTIONS (PSI)

- Meeting graduation requirements does not equal meeting PSI requirements
 - Other factors outside of grades that may influence PSI acceptance:
 - Every PSI has its own requirements, and each faculty (department) has its own requirements
- *IMPORTANT** Requirements can change at any time: it is **YOUR** responsibility to inform yourself of the most up to date admission requirements.
