Dear Carson Graham Community,

It's difficult to believe that we are half way through June and there is just over a week of regular class remaining! Please see below for some important information as we finish off the school year.

New Indigenous-Focused Graduation Requirement

As part of the Province of British Columbia's commitments to truth, reconciliation, and anti-racism, the Ministry of Education has updated the BC Graduation Program requirements. Moving forward, the Ministry is implementing an Indigenous-focused graduation requirement for all students in British Columbia. Under the new model, students who are currently in Grade 10 will be the first group to complete this updated course credit requirement by graduation in June of 2024.

The change requires that all students complete at least one 4-credit course with an Indigenous focus prior to graduation. It does not change the number of credits required for graduation which remains at 80.

To ensure that our current grade 10 students will meet the new graduation requirement, Carson Graham will be enrolling all students in English First Peoples 11, as opposed to the English course selected at the time of course programming.

The new 4-credit graduation requirement will provide all BC students with the necessary time and opportunity to develop deeper understandings of the experiences, cultures, and histories of Indigenous peoples in Canada, in support of the K-12 mandate to develop Educated Citizens.

Truth, Healing, and Reconciliation is one of the core pillars of North Vancouver School District's Strategic Plan and is echoed in the Provincial Government's passing of the Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act. We look forward to working with our Grad Class of 2024 to roll out this new graduation requirement which will have an impact on our province for years to come.
