Dear Grade 8 Parents/Guardians,

On behalf of the Carson Graham Secondary community, we would like to extend a warm welcome to the newest members of our Carson Graham family! Our administrative team of myself, Ms. Stephanie Strandt (Grade 8 & 10 Administrator), Mr. Tuzar Irani (Grade 9 & 11 Administrator) and Ms. Kim Jonat (Principal and Grade 12 Administrator) are truly excited about the upcoming year.

We hope you have enjoyed a wonderful summer with friends and family. As summer winds down and the school year approaches, you and your child(ren) may be filled with both excitement and nervous anticipation for the new school year and the transition to high school. All students will receive their timetables on the first day of school, Tuesday September 2nd. Grade 8's will arrive at the school by 9:15 for a welcome assembly in the Carson Graham gym at 9:30am. This will be followed by the distribution of information packages and school photos. Grade 8 students will have plenty of time to locate their lockers and track down the location of their classes in advance of classes commencing on Wednesday September 3rd. Carson Graham staff and students will be available to help our Grade 8s navigate the opening day.

Yesterday you received a detailed school newsletter, the daily schedule, and a month-by-month calendar. All information will also be posted on our Carson Graham school website before the Labour Day weekend. Throughout the school year, please regularly visit the school website and read the newsletters emailed home to stay up to date.

Communication and contact between home and school is still particularly important at the secondary level. We recognize that parent involvement in high school naturally tends to decrease as students get older and take on more responsibility for their learning. Many grade 8 students, as they begin to feel more independent, will try to convince you that they do not need your help or for you to take an active role throughout the year, however, our experience tells us that this is not true. In fact, we encourage you to stay as involved.
