Reminders

Attendance & Punctuality – First block

First block is when we see the most late arrivals. Consistent attendance and punctuality are key to academic success and building positive routines. Students are expected to be in class, ready to learn with their materials out at 9:10am

Here are some tips to help your teen arrive on time:

- Set a consistent bedtime and morning routine to ensure enough sleep and a smooth start.
- **Prepare the night before**—pack backpacks, lay out clothes, and plan lunches.
- **Use alarms strategically**—consider setting multiple alarms and placing an alarm across the room so it requires getting out of bed.
- Plan for travel time—account for traffic, bus schedules, or walking distances.
- **Encourage accountability**—check in with your teen about their schedule (check attendance on MyEd) and **celebrate punctuality improvements and successes.**
- Encourage students to come during tutorial and grab breakfast from the Eagle's Nest! Tutorial is from 8:30am to 9:10am daily.

Consistent punctuality helps students start class calm, focused, and ready to learn. Even small adjustments can make a big difference.


