

- Study block applications may be considered if you:
 - Have a good record of attendance and punctuality
 - Register for an OL course during the 2023-2024 school year (check with universities regarding deadlines for course completion)
 - Etc.

*Please note, to be considered for scholarships and awards at Carson Graham, Grade 12 students must have a min. of 7 courses. The rigor of the course load is also taken into consideration.






