# MATH FLOW CHART








## SUPPORT PROGRAMS/CLASSES

# STUDY BLOCK

- All Gr. 11's are encouraged to take a **full course load of 8 classes**. If you have a heavy academic load or have extenuating circumstances, please speak to Ms. Marshall about a study block application that you must complete with parent signature.
- All Gr. 12's are encouraged to take a minimum of **7 courses at Carson plus CLC 12**. Please speak to Ms. McKay if you wish to request a study block. You must complete an application form complete with parent signature.
- **Study block applications may be considered if you:**
  - Have a good record of attendance and punctuality
  - Register for an OL course during the 2023-2024 school year (check with universities regarding deadlines for course completion)
  - Etc.

\*Please note, to be considered for scholarships and awards at Carson Graham, Grade 12 students must have a min. of 7 courses. The rigor of the course load is also taken into consideration.




- Notify your counsellor as soon as possible if you plan to apply
- Minimum of 15 hours per week of specific training in their ONE discipline year-round, minimum C+ average
