- This course provides a broad overview of how relationships form and change. We will explore workplace, community, and family relationships, as well as friendships and committed relationships. - Typically, no credit for Peak Performance
- Notify your counsellor as soon as possible if you plan to apply
- Minimum of 15 hours per week of specific training in their ONE discipline year-round, minimum C+ average



A FEW NOTES ON POST SECONDARY INSTITUTIONS (PSI)

- Meeting graduation requirements does not equal meeting PSI requirements
- Other factors outside of grades that may influence PSI acceptance:
- Every PSI has its own requirements, and each faculty (department) has its own requirements
 - *IMPORTANT Requirements can change at any time: it is **YOUR** responsibility to inform yourself of the most up to date admission requirements.

- Jan 24 Feb 15: <u>Students</u> ENTER COURSES INTO MYED BC
- Feb 23nd at the latest, signed course programming forms are due to main office
- Your counsellor will review forms and requests in MyEd. (Courses in MyEd <u>MUST</u> match what is on the form)

- Later changes will be more difficult to accommodate due to timetable constraints.
- Course requests are not guaranteed
- Timetables are subject to change through late August to early September.


