Extenuating circumstances may be considered
*Please note, to be considered for scholarships and awards at Carson Graham, Grade I2 students must have a min. of 7 courses. The rigor of the course load is also taken into consideration.

- Meeting graduation requirements does not equal meeting PSI requirements
- Other factors outside of grades that may influence PSI acceptance:
- Every PSI has its own requirements, and each faculty (department) has its own requirements
*IMPORTANT Requirements can change at any time: it is YOUR responsibility to inform yourself of the most up to date admission requirements.

- Feb 23nd - at the latest, signed course programming forms are due to main office
- Your counsellor will review forms and requests in MyEd. (Courses in MyEd MUST match what is on the form)
