6. "Present knowledge is wholly dependent on past knowledge." Discuss this claim with reference to **two** areas of knowledge.

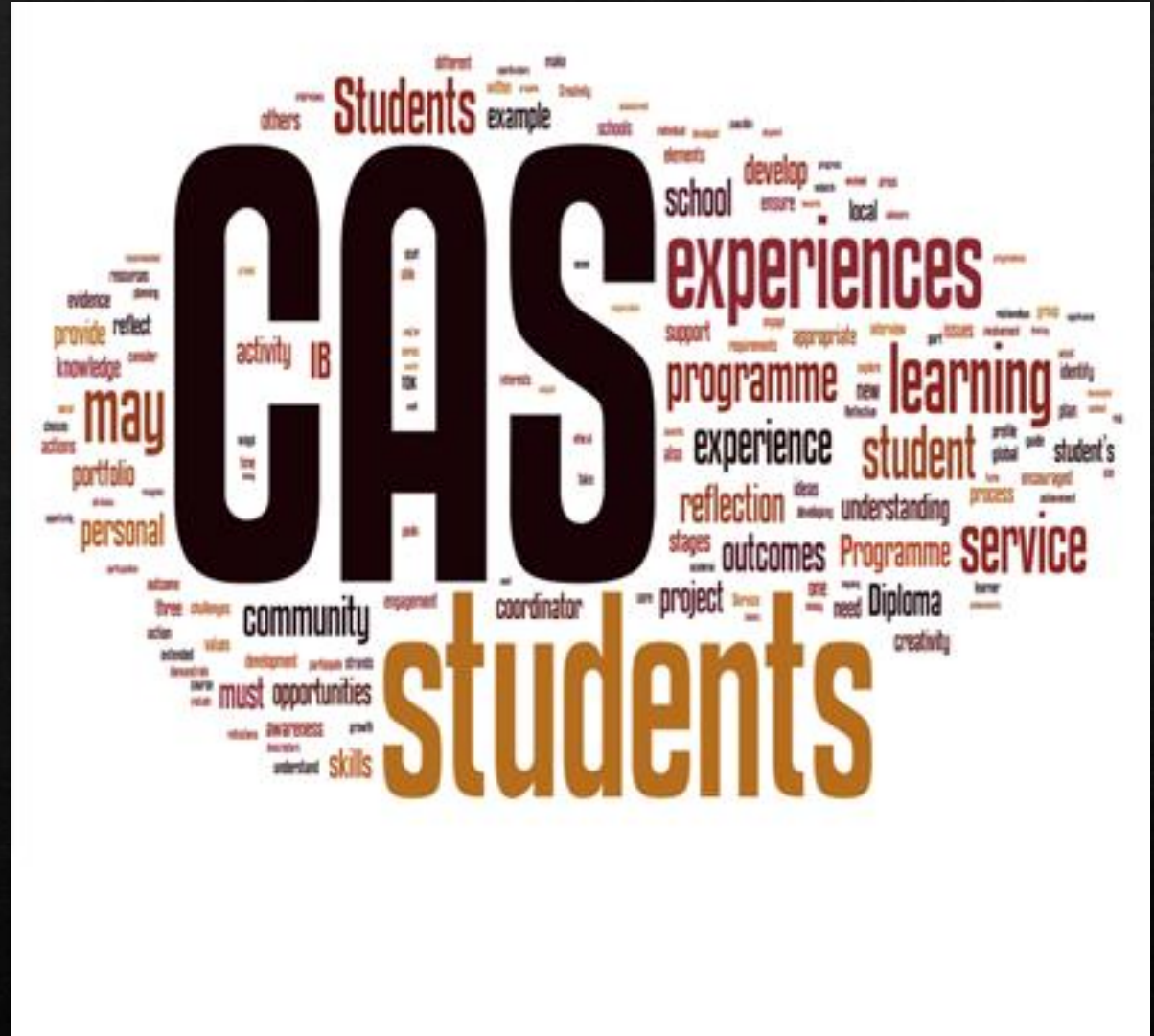

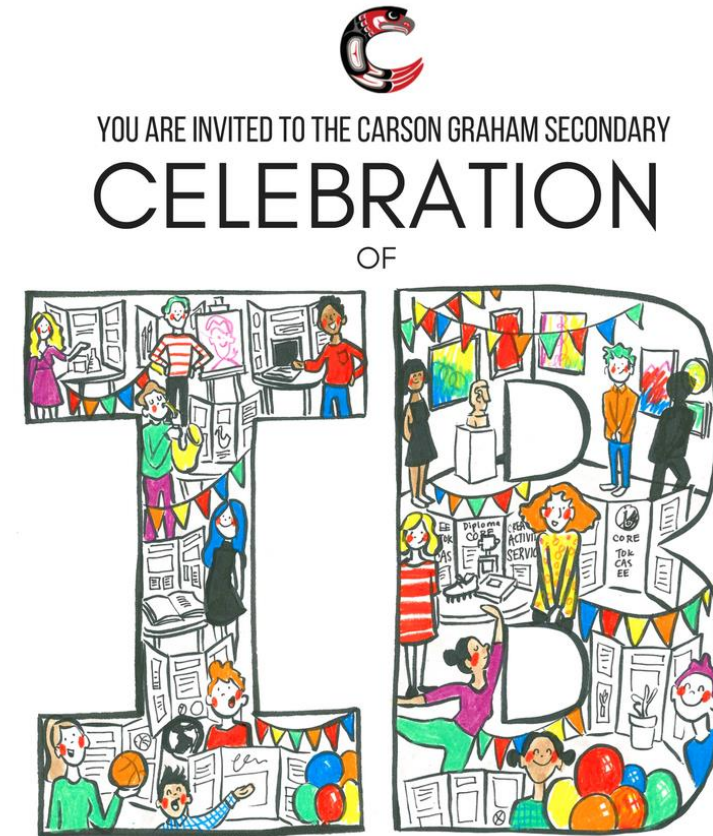

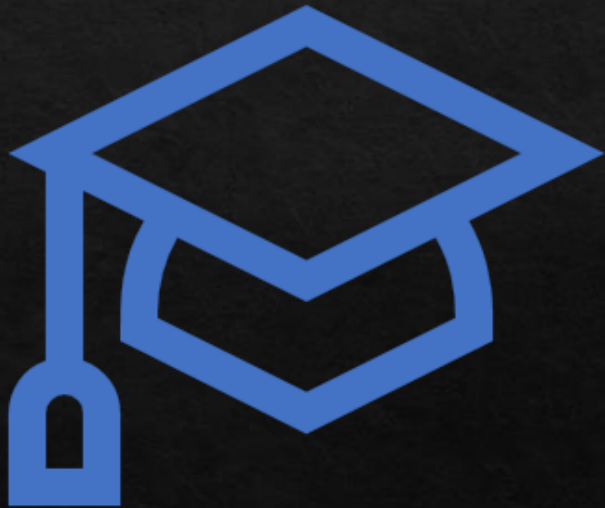

Earning the IB Diploma



Minimum of 24 points

- **CAS** requirements must be met.
- **Theory of Knowledge & Extended Essay** must be completed at a passing level (A through D)
- All **Internal Assessments** for all courses must be completed
- No level 1 in any subject.
- No more than two Level 2's in any subject.
- No more than three Level 3's or below.
- **At least 12 points on HL subjects.**
- **At least 9 points on SL subjects.**

Information detailed in *General Regulations: Diploma Programme*

DP Assessment

- ◇ Consists of
 - ◇ Internal Assessment (IA's)
 - ◇ External Assessment (Exams 70-80%)
- ◇ These two components combine to make up the final IB score.

Internal Assessment:

- ◇ Assessed internally by the teacher and moderated by an IB moderator
- ◇ Each course has unique IA specifications
- ◇ **IA Deadlines are very important**
- ◇ DP team has a 2 year timeline to spread out the IA's for student balance
 - ◇ Year 1: CAS, EE, Geo, History, Lang & Lit, TOK
 - ◇ Year 2: Art, Lang & Lit, Language B, Math, Sciences

External Assessment:

- ◇ Each course has unique set of multiple papers over multiple days
- ◇ There is **NO flexibility on dates** for these exams
- ◇ *do not make plans during this time*

Note: this year DP exams go over May long weekend.

- ◇ Preparation starts now and should ramp up after Spring Break



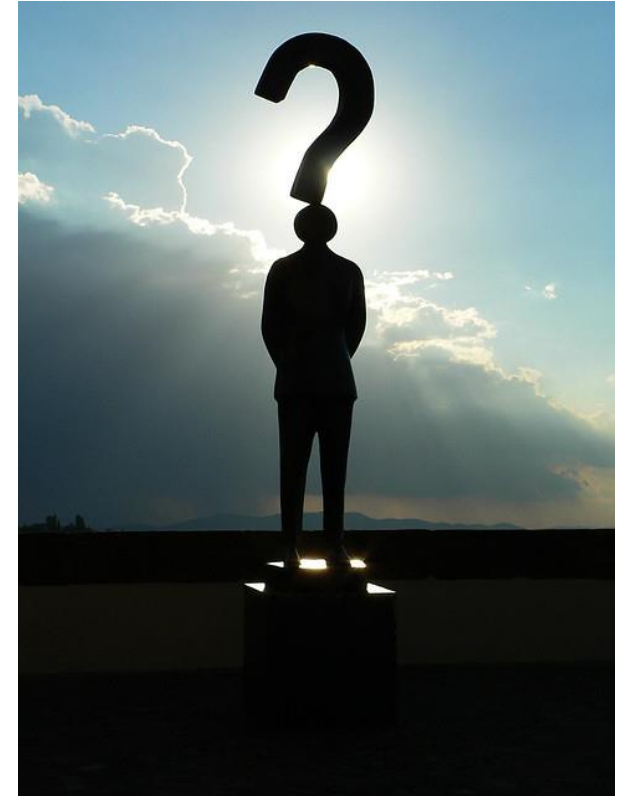

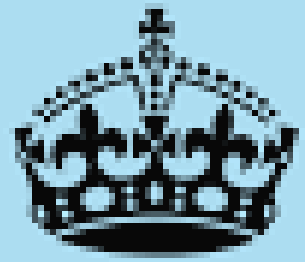

How to apply for Admissions

- ◆ Pay Fee (Credit card)
- ◆ Self-Reporting BC%? - use Transcript Verification or Term 1 Report Card
- ◆ Self-Reporting IB Grades? - use Current IB Level from Report Card 1 or see Coordinator
- ◆ Check status ongoing



What about my grades?

◆ **Admission Averages**

- ◆ GPA based on Total IB Score OR Gr 12 & Gr 11 courses
- ◆ 5 to 6 courses – each school has their own list

◆ **Self-reporting grades (if required)**

- ◆ Use Term 1 Grades from your Report Card

◆ **Coordinator reported grades (if required)**

- ◆ Request coordinator to send to school one time

What about my grades?

- ◆ **Electronic transmission of grades**
- ◆ **PSI Selection Form**
 - ◆ Indicates which schools to send your grades to
 - ◆ Most students fill out in CLC (Career Life Connections)
 - ◆ You have to do this on your own
 - ◆ Marks sent automatically to those selected
 - ◆ 2nd Term Grades - in April/Final Grades – in August

Final IB Official Transcript

- ◆ Can choose up to 3 schools CDN to send IB grades to
- ◆ Must communicate choices to coordinator
- ◆ Final IB Transcript sent automatically to those selected

Researching University Admissions

- ◆ Must look at each website for information specific to that institution
- ◆ Be specific when searching:
- ◆ Including “IB” “undergraduate” and “admissions” will help you get to the most accurate information
- ◆ Transfer credit is different at each school
- ◆ Admissions averages/intake is different at each school
- ◆ Some use IB scores
- ◆ Others use % grades

Cap U Application process - IB

- ◆ Applications open now
- ◆ **You can report your grades to us between January 15 and March 31.**
- ◆ **You can only self-report your grades once**, so be sure to wait until you know your midterm grades or feel you are best able to provide a good estimate of the final grades you will achieve.
- ◆ International Baccalaureate students are eligible for admission on the basis of successful completion of the IB Diploma.
- ◆ Capilano University English Language Requirements and program specific requirements must also be met.
- ◆ For those students who are completing both the IB Diploma and another high school curriculum, Capilano will use the credential which offers the applicant the best advantage.

UBC Application process - IB

- ◇ **December 1st** – Application deadline for students wishing to be considered for Major Entrance Scholarships
- ◇ **January 15th** – General application deadline for all students
- ◇ **February - May**
- ◇ Predicted grades generally in by February 18th for offers by mid-April
- ◇ **IB Predicted grades will be forwarded by the IB Coordinator**
- ◇ Skip the Academic Profile section (non IB students only)

SFU Application process - IB

- ◇ **October** - Application for admission for Fall term opens
- ◇ **December 3rd** – Deadline to apply for major entrance scholarships and entrance bursaries
- ◇ **January 15th** – Deadline to submit documents for major entrance scholarships
- ◇ **January 31st** – Deadline to apply for admission
- ◇ Predicted grades generally in by February 18th for admission offers by May
- ◇ Offers of admission are based on Predicted Grades.
- ◇ **IB Co-ordinator will submit on students' behalf**

SFU Application process - IB

- ◆ One full year of [transfer credit](#) (30 units) is granted for a completed IB Diploma. Transfer credit is awarded for all standard level and higher level subjects passed with a grade of 4 or higher.
- ◆ IB Diploma holders with total predicted IB points in the high 20s, including bonus points, will qualify for early conditional admission to most programs.

UVic Application process - IB

- ◇ **February 28th** Application deadline for all students
- ◇ **Self-report** your interim/final grade 11 and 12 marks or predicted IB score on your UVic application between **February 15** and **March 31**.
- ◇ **You can only self-report your grades once**, so be sure to wait until you know your midterm grades or feel you are best able to provide a good estimate of the final grades you will achieve.

University Applications

- ◆ START NOW!
- ◆ It is the Students' responsibility to let me know what schools they are applying to!
- ◆ Must include the students # for each university

Once you apply

- ◆ Keep track of all applications – Careers Binder / in the cloud / old school file folder
- ◆ Will receive student # & info on how to access your student site
- ◆ Look for contact info in confirmation email/letter
- ◆ Check if additional/supplemental applications are needed
- ◆ Continue to monitor account for any additional paperwork/deadlines etc.

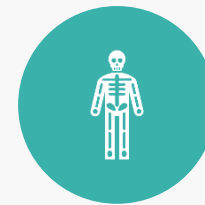

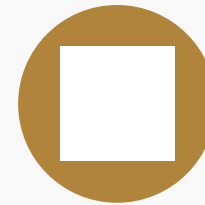

Provincial Government Scholarships & Awards



- ◆ **BC Excellence Scholarships (55 awards of \$5000)**
 - ◆ 1 student nominated per school
 - ◆ Winners demonstrate community service and aptitude/commitment to chosen career path.
- ◆ **BC Achievement Scholarships**
 - ◆ BC Achievement Scholarships recognize the top 8000 graduates in the province. \$1250
 - ◆ Ministry determines recipients based on achievement in Gr 10, 11, & 12 courses including electives.

Specific Criteria – depends on Scholarship or Bursary - can include leadership, financial need, etc

Community Scholarships

Decided by the Organization

Often have their own application

Carson is not involved in process

Affiliation Scholarships

Sports/CUPE/workplace etc.

Sponsored by private organizations

Information and application deadlines are ongoing

Sometimes a parent or grandparent must be a member or employee

Check with employers!

Many do not send information directly to schools



Loans and Bursaries

Bursaries – for financial need

- ◇ Require Income statement/Budget/Family contribution
- ◇ Non-Repayable

Loans

- ◇ Government program
- ◇ Studentaidbc.ca
- ◇ Repayable



Reference Letters

- ◇ Students often require letters of reference for scholarships & bursaries
- ◇ Students should think about which teacher knows them best and can best speak to the specific strengths and experiences.
 - ◇ *Remember, teachers write reference letters on a voluntary basis*
- ◇ Students should ask teachers well in advance to give them time to write a thoughtful letter.
- ◇ Students should be prepared to provide a resume or other information to support the letter.
