
Reminders/Information:

The Spring Festival and the Lunar New Year

This weekend people around the world will be celebrating the first New Moon of the year. In China, the week-long event is known as the Spring Festival. In Canada, we have historically called it Chinese New Year, although recently we have started using the term "Lunar New Year" since the day is also recognized in other countries including Korea, Vietnam, Malaysia, and Singapore.

While the specific celebrations and festivities differ between the cultures, many events centre around food, family, gift giving, long life, reconnection and renewal. Symbols of this celebration include lanterns, fireworks, red pockets, symbolic foods (like dumplings and long noodles), as well as the posters with the character for fortune 福 (which are traditionally hung upside-down).

The Chinese Zodiac is also related to these festivities. The 12 year calendar assigns a different animal to each year, and associates different character traits of those animals with people born in that year. There are also elements (Earth, Fire, Wood, Water, Metal) associated with each year. This year marks the Year of the Wood Dragon.

"The Wood Dragon is the energy of spring, of reaching toward the light while deepening roots into the soil." - Tsao-Lin Moy
