

Message from RCMP: Warmer Weather Brings Increase in Bike and Scooter Thefts

With the return of warmer weather, the school district is seeing an increase in scooter and bike thefts from school bike racks. These thefts are often crimes of opportunity, and unfortunately, students' bikes and scooters are frequent targets.





A reminder to students and families to:

- * Record the serial number, make and model of their bike or scooter, and keep it somewhere safe in case it needs to be reported stolen (a photo is also helpful).
- * Use a high-quality U-lock or heavy-duty lock (not just cable locks as they have been easily and quickly cut).

Safety and Flow in the Parking Lots During Drop Off & Pick Up

A reminder that our parking lots are designed for one-way traffic movement only.

When travel by car is necessary, we ask parents to **make use of designated drop off areas** located at the front of the building ONLY. **The west parking lot is NOT a pick up zone.**

To ensure flow, please <u>DO NOT STOP IN THE MIDDLE OF THE PARKING LOTS OR ON THE</u> STREET FOR DROP OFF.

Students will need to arrive at least 15 minutes before the scheduled start of their assessment. This gives time to log in and ensure students are all set up for the assessment start time.

Please remember to bring a PEN/PENCIL and CALCULATOR (NOT GRAPHING) to the session and power down cellphones/electronics before entering the exam room.

Any students who are unable to make the June sessions due to **extenuating circumstances**, will be able to write at subsequent catch-up session in October/November 2025.


Grade 8 Science Fair— May 21st




Classroom Spotlight—Careers 10

What? A new service at Handsworth! The Handsworth Writing Lab (HWL).

When? Most weeks open Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays at lunch. Check the calendar outside 2002 for specific dates.

Where? Room 2002

Who is the service for?

- Any student in grades 8-12 who needs extra support with their writing or wants to take their writing to the next level.
- There are special days where we focus on things like punctuation, creative writing, extending ideas, and spelling.
- In May we will have a special session for grade 11 students that will focus on writing postsecondary applications. At the beginning of May, check the calendar outside 2002 to confirm the date.
