

As always, we continue to encourage students to walk, bike or transit to school whenever possible.











Booking is done online. Please note that this is a "first come, first serve" system and slots will fill up quickly. Do take note of the booking opening times, read the instructions carefully and act fast!

Pro Tip! Log on and create your account now, so that when the booking window opens, you are immediately ready to book appointments. Please note the User Profile has to be completed once per school year.

1st Booking Window- OPENS Monday, March 10th @ 6pm to Friday, March 31st @ 6pm: parents limited to 3 appointments per student in this window.

2nd Booking Window- OPENS Thursday, April 3rd @ 6pm: parents will be able to schedule additional appointments up to a max of 6 per student.

Booking Window closes - Monday, April 7th @ 3pm; appointments will no longer accepted on the booking system once the window closes.

Our program became respectable again and provided an outstanding athletic experience for over 100 boys each year.

Let us not forget that he accomplished all of this without a field at Handsworth. That in itself is a tremendous feat. Darren left our program in a much better place than he found and for that, we are forever grateful.

2025 Japan Exchange Prepares for Departure!

The 30 Grade 9 students of this year's Japan Exchange are busy preparing for our upcoming departure!

Classes on Japanese culture, etiquette, origami, and the preparation of presentations have been ongoing since the fall and will continue until departure to prepare students to represent Handsworth and North Vancouver during our travels to and throughout Japan!

On April 8th the students will depart for a two-week cultural experience of Japan, this program has been running at Handsworth for over 35 years! During the first week they will be visiting the historic and cultural centres of Kyoto, Nara, Hiroshima, and Takayama. During the second week they will be home staying with students at Handsworth's sister school of Inage in Chiba, Japan (the sister city of North Vancouver) fully immersing themselves in Japan culture, returning on April 22nd.

Japan Exchange Program Returns to its Roots for the 2025-26 School Year!

An opportunity for students currently in grade 8!

One of the longest running cultural programs at Handsworth is the Grade 9 Japan Exchange, which began in 1989! The current model of the exchange with Inage International High School, our sister school, in Chiba began in 1992 and has run every year since with the exceptions of 2011 and 2020–2022, following the earthquake and tsunami and COVID-19 restrictions.

The exchange aims to immerse students in not only the history but also the culture of Japan, and to give them the opportunity and responsibility to function as ambassadors for not only Handsworth but also North Vancouver within Japan as a whole and specifically with Chiba, North Vancouver's sister city.

For the first time since 2019, Inage International High School is returning to North Vancouver in October!

This will begin student's exposure to the Japanese experience by hosting Japanese students in their homes for a portion of their one-week visit, establishing the connections that become so critical in later stages of the program, and establishing in many cases lifelong connections with their exchange partners from both Handsworth and Chiba. Throughout the fall and winter students undertake seminars in language, customs, and culture to gain an understanding of what they will experience during their visit to Japan in the spring.

In April participants travel to Japan for two weeks. The first week is spent exploring and experiencing different regions and centres on Honshu and Hokkaido including historical and cultural capitals of Japan, immersing themselves in both urban and rural Japan acting as youth peace ambassadors at the Peace Memorial in Hiroshima. Throughout the week students are provided the opportunity to expand their sense-of-self, responsibility, and cultural awareness as they navigate the sites in small groups, taking in the language, culture and food of the different regions and the country as a whole.

The second week of the exchange brings with it one of the most important aspects of the experience which sets it apart from it just being a trip to Japan, and unique amongst other cultural experiences in the North Vancouver School District. Students billet in Japanese homes, experiencing the day-to-day lives of their host families and how the lives of Japanese high school students differ and most importantly are similar to their own at home here in North Vancouver, taking part in classes and popular recreation activities. As part of our role as ambassadors' students take part in formal activities such as visits to Mayor's office in Chiba, on behalf of the Mayor of North Vancouver, helping to foster the relationship between the cities.

Many of the students who have taken part in the exchange look back with fondness on the experience, frequently referring to it as life changing, even decades after they return.

Stay tuned for notice of an information meeting for the 2025-2026 program that will be held in May 2025.

Each year at École Handsworth, our French Immersion students can sign up to compete in the Concours d'art oratoire, a public-speaking contest created by Canadian Parents for French. This offers students an opportunity to stimulate their interest in French, improve their speaking and pronunciation skills, and to share their passion for a topic of their interest.

This year, we will be holding our school finals on March 6th and March 7th, with more information to follow on which grades will present when. This year, we will be assessing two categories of competition: French Immersion and Francophone. Handsworth French Immersion teachers will select a finalist for each grade level and category. Successful candidates will then compete at the school-district contest on April 2nd, 2025.


Grade 11 French Exposition In Learning Commons a Huge Success





Ms. Jung's Marketing 11 classes Plan their Own Super Bowl

Ms. Jung's Marketing 11 students have been working on a whole class project where they run their own Super Bowl by researching previous Super Bowls, cultural aspects, marketing and operations and then planning their own Super Bowl. The details of the project ranged from choosing the host city, architectural aspects of the stadiums, safety and security, fan zones, marketing, sales (cost analysis), accounting, community events, working with Indigenous Nations, the half-time performance, risk analysis, broadcasting, filming, and viewership.

This is a rare opportunity for students to experience looking at the inner workings of a large-scale televised event that they may have only been the observers or viewers for in the past. The project allows for students to figure out their focus within a business lens (marketing and audiences, operations, finance, or systemic organization) and apply their understanding to work together from start to finish.

Ms. Jung's Period 4 class chose Seattle to host and plan their Super Bowl and her Period 7 class chose Atlanta.
