BC GRADUATION PROGRAM



- Dogwood Diploma
- Begins with grade 10 courses
- Minimum of 80 credits in grades 10, 11, and 12
 - **52 credits** (13 courses) are required courses
 - **28 credits** (7 courses) are elective courses
 - Minimum 16 credits (4 courses) must be at the Grade 12 level

*UBC requires "Proficient" (3) on the Grade 12 Literacy Assessment to maintain your offer of admission. BC high school applicants who do not meet this level of proficiency will have their admission offers reviewed on a case-by-case basis.







ENTRANCE – Post-Secondary

 Sept 2026 admission: Canadian universities no longer have a second language entrance requirement for undergraduate programs


COURSE OPTIONS – ADVANCED PLACEMENT

- Offered in some subject areas see Handsworth Course Guide
- Successful completion of an AP course earns credit toward graduation
- Successful completion of an AP course and/or exam may earn university credit
 - Check with university directly
- Impact on post-secondary applications
- Course results appear on student transcripts; AP exam results do not
- Exam schedules are set by the AP college board typically May
- College Board has more information

HOW TO ENTER MY REQUESTS MyEducation BC

- Login ID and recovery
 email are on your course
 request sheet
 - Password is not
- Instructions for login and course request entry were sent to parents and are on the <u>Handsworth website</u>


- Login to MyEd <u>www.myeducation.gov.bc.ca/aspen</u>
- Enter your user ID (pupil number followed by nv ex. '123564nv') and password your user ID and is on the white sticker on your course sheet!
 - You may immediately get a "Password has Expired" pop-up; click OK
 - b. Re-enter your password and then create your new password
 - Passwords must have 8 characters, 1 upper case letter, 1 numeral and a symbol
 - You may be prompted to enter an 'Email' for password recovery.
 Your email will be your SD44 email (ex. 012345s@sd44.ca)
 - You may be prompted to choose a security question and enter a response (choose something you will remember)
- 3. Please see next page for more specific password reset instructions.

Now you are in and can do the following...

- A. Click on the "My Info" tab along the top of the screen
- Click on the "Requests" side tab; check you are in Entry Mode
- C. Read the general instructions then click on the first "Select" button
- Use your sheet to choose the correct courses
- E. Select your alternate courses in "Alternates" section only
- F. When you are done selecting courses Click on "Post"
- G. Log out!
- H. Return Signed/Completed Course Request Sheet to Office by March 3rd



NOTE: <u>if you can't seem to see a course</u>, but it should be there to choose, <u>CLICK THE 'NEXT' ARROW</u> to see more items on the list of courses.



STUDY BLOCK

- First study block from CLC
- Second study block requires an application pick up and submit form in counselling suite
- Criteria
 - Challenging course load and/or significant extra-curricular commitments
 - Strong record of good attendance and engagement
 - Strong record of school and/or community citizenship
- Responsibilities
 - Actively working during the study block in the library, breakout spaces, grand commons, or in a classroom with a teachers permission or are off campus under a parent's supervision
 - Maintain a minimum number of courses (6 courses + CLC)
 - Understand how reduced numbers of courses may affect post-secondary applications
- Placement of study blocks in the schedule done at random

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- We build the timetable based on the courses you request
- Take time to carefully consider your options
- Request courses based on your interests, your capacity, and your future
- Course changes must be requested before mid-September deadline
- Course withdrawals will affect scholarship/award,
 references, and athletics opportunities
