Hello Parents/Guardians and Graduates of 2028:

We are looking forward to officially welcoming you to Handsworth this September and are excited to share more detailed information about our Grade 8 Retreat for all of our new grade 8s on September 21st, 2023! Our goals for this year's retreat include:

- Contribute to a strong sense of belonging to the school community through shared experiences with peers, student leaders, and Handsworth Staff.
- Build connections with peers and our student leaders to support the transition to high school.
- Set the tone for a positive and inclusive start to students' secondary school journey.
- Connect Grade 8 students with experiential and land-based learning at Cheakamus.

The cost of the retreat is \$125 and can be paid late August/early Sept. via the Handsworth School Cash Online payment system available through the link provided on the school website - School Cash Online. The NVSD has subsidized the cost of the retreat and transportation to ensure that the cost is as low as possible for families. This \$125 fee includes:

- Activities at the Cheakamus Centre in Brackendale
- Return Highway Coach transportation to and from Handsworth to the Cheakamus Centre
- Meals and snacks at the Cheakamus Centre (lunch on site and snacks)
- Program facilitator support
- Student leaders, supplies, and materials
- Welcome swag, snacks for Grade 8s

Our hope is that all Grade 8 students attend the retreat. Regular Grade 8 classes will not be running during the day of Sept 21st; therefore, students will not be missing any classes during the Grade 8 retreat day. We understand that due to family or community commitments or unforeseen health reasons, some students will not attend this retreat and alternate activities and learnings will be planned here at Handsworth. If your child is <u>not</u> attending the retreat, please email me (Meghan Downie) ASAP.

As a Handsworth staff, we are excited about the prospect of starting the 2023-2024 school year with such an impactful and memorable experience for our students.

Remember to ask yourself: Will I be warm and dry?

- * **Appropriate clothing** is very important for your enjoyment, comfort, and safety. A primary consideration is the material from which the item is made. Materials can be divided into three general categories:
- 1. Cotton: a good fiber for hot, sunny weather but loses all insulating value when wet.
- 2. Wool: provides excellent insulation in cold, wet weather. Retains insulating value when wet.
- 3. Synthetics: provide excellent insulation in cold wet weather, retains insulating value when wet.

Weather at Cheakamus Centre is often colder and wetter than North Vancouver. Even on warm days, the weather may turn cold and wet in a matter of hours. Rain may persist through an entire ODS program.

We strongly recommend wearing wool or synthetic clothing and waterproof gear.
