- Black History Month
 - February is Black History Month. To acknowledge the role many Black Canadians have in our history, students attended an informative and engaging presentation, "Black History Matters" by Giselle Clarke-Trenaman from Presentation House. This week, our primary students learned about prominent Black Canadians, including several from British Columbia. Next week, our intermediate students will have the opportunity to attend these engaging and informative sessions. At the end of each session, Larson was gifted a picture book about Black History. 


<u>Request for Family Assistance form</u>
