The North Shore Safety Council met on October 4 at Delbrook Rec Centre and one of our Larson parents, Dan Ross, was in attendance to bring our concerns regarding traffic safety during school pick-up and drop-off.

North Shore Safety Council (NSSC) was established in 1954 as an educational, advisory and advocacy organization. NSSC is a Society in BC and is a registered federal charity.

NSSC's main program is Elmer the Safety Elephant – teaching pedestrian and bike safety to Kindergarten and Grade 1 students in all elementary schools in NVSD, WVSD, preschools, daycares and private schools.

The most recent public forum, held in early 2017, was called **Slow Down** North Shore, which has now become a campaign that in its early stages features an on-line survey "Rate Your Street" -
