Appropriate clothing is very important for your enjoyment, comfort, and safety. Our recommended fabrics are as follows:

- Wool: provides excellent insulation in cold, wet weather and retains insulating value even
- Synthetics (e.g. polyester, fleece): also provide excellent insulation in cold wet weather, and retains insulating value when wet somewhat lighter, more compact and faster drying than wool.

The weather at Cheakamus Centre is often colder and wetter than North Vancouver. Even on warm days, the weather may turn cold and wet in a matter of hours or rain may persist throughout an entire ODS program.

Always check the Squamish forecast prior to your program, and pack accordingly.

We strongly recommend packing wool or synthetic clothing and waterproof gear (jacket, pants, and boots).


