Cell Phones at School:

The first week of our new cell phone policy at Larson has been good. There have been a few students who needed reminders, but the majority of students have been respectful. Thank you parents and guardians for your support ensuring your children respect this policy and helping to keep Larson safe from an online activity happening while at school

As we mentioned last week, we recommend that you regularly check your child's cell phone use. Again, this is not an invasion of privacy. They are still children and learning to use this technology in respectful and safe ways.

Sickness Procedures:

Please remember to keep your child home if they are showing any signs or symptoms of being sick. This is very important to make sure that Larson stays a healthy environment for all. If your child's symptoms persist for more than a few days, please have your doctor take a look just in case the sickness is related to a bacterial infection which would need antibiotics. According to Vancouver Coastal Health, children must remain at home for at least 24 hours after the first dose of antibiotics, and of course until symptoms are gone.

Thank you for your cooperation and help in keep Larson safe and healthy.

Student Behaviour:

We have seen some amazing student behaviour this week. We have noticed students helping other students when they were hurt or lonely. We have observed older students providing wonderful care for younger students when they are in buddy classes. There is some amazing art up around the school showing how much Larson students value and respect people from all walks of life, including race, gender, faith, culture, sexual orientation and gender identity.

We are still seeing incidences of name calling and some mean behaviour, but we feel that it is decreasing. We will continue to focus large amounts of energy on the continued improvement of behaviour that we can all be proud of.

We don't want children to feel bad asking for food, so we will provide something, but we ask that you have a discussion with your child or children about their food needs while at school.
