TRAFFIC UPDATE- Be safe getting to school!

EXIT 22 PERMANENT CLOSURE:

You may have seen this in the North Shore News already, but if you've missed it Highway Exit 22 at the bottom of the Cut will be closing permanently as of May 31st. This is the eastbound off ramp that connects Fern Street with Keith Road. For those coming down the Cut and headed for Mount Seymour Parkway or Lillooet Rd, you will now need to exit at the Mountain Highway off ramp to access our area.

The District of North Vancouver has given us a heads up about the ongoing construction and pavement on Orwell. If you are returning to Lynnmour/Xá7elcha next week, we encourage you to walk safely to school. If you are driving, please try to come to the front entrance off Forsman and avoid Orwell all together. Accessing the school from Forsman will be the safest route by vehicle for the weeks to come.
