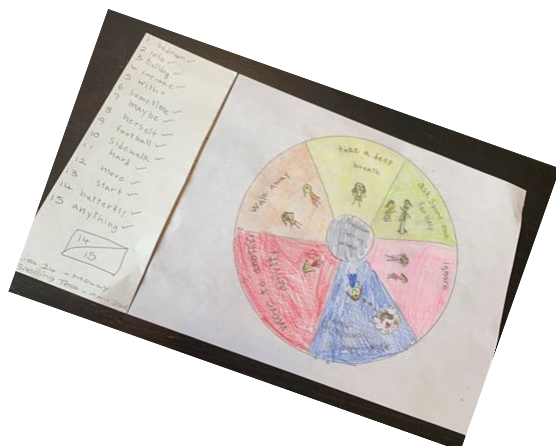
Lynn Valley Learning

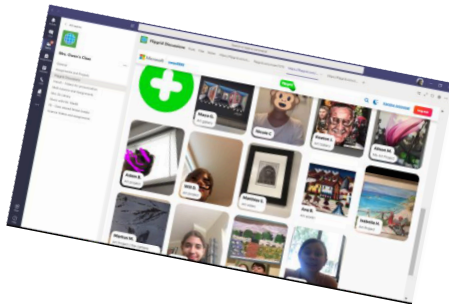

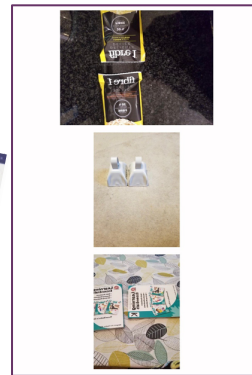
