Code of Conduct

In accordance with *School District #44 Policy #302* students at Montroyal Elementary School are expected to meet the standards set out in the *BC Human Rights Code (Sections 7 & 8)* that include the prohibited grounds of discrimination, behaviours that discriminate against a person or class of person by publishing or displaying a statement, publication, notice, sign, symbol, emblem or other representation that indicates discrimination based on the race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, religion, marital status, family status, physical or mental disability, gender, sexual orientation, or age of that person or that group or class of persons. Students and adults at Montroyal are expected to follow our Code of Conduct.

Members of the Montroyal Community are responsible for knowing the behaviour expected of them (following our essential agreements and managing inappropriate behaviours). Every effort is made to emphasize a problem-solving approach where respect and kindness are key.

Students are encouraged to solve problems independently, or with assistance using following these steps:

Stop: Walk away, take deep breaths, calm down, get control
 Think: How should I handle this? (Ignore? Say something?)

• Talk: Calmly tell the person what you don't like and what you expect

• Reflect: Resume the activity, walk away, or get help from an adult

Our Safe and Caring School Community Depends on You

Usually behaviour is like a mirror - what you put out to the world is reflected back to you. If you treat others kindly, they will likely treat you kindly in return. If you speak to others the way you'd like to be spoken to, they will likely speak to you respectfully. If your actions are safe, others will likely try to be safe too. All students can model safe and caring behaviour for each other.

When behaviour concerns arise, please be a helper in the problem-solving process. Some ways you can do this include:

- ✓ Follow adult instructions on *first ask*.
- ✓ Be an effective communicator. Use "I" statements to express your feelings and needs.
- ✓ Apologize if you hurt someone else physically or emotionally.
- ✓ Own your part of the problem. Take responsibility for your words and/or actions.
- ✓ Follow through with consequences of your misbehaviour and learn from your mistakes.
- ✓ Be part of the solution, not part of the problem.
- ✓ Stay out of problems that don't involve you.

Consequences for Unkind and/or Unsafe Behaviour

When students fail to adhere to the Code of Conduct, decisions about consequences or restitution for students' actions will be made considering the situation and the age of the child. Staff members aim to establish logical and age-appropriate consequences for misbehaviours. Older students who have been in school longer have had more opportunity to learn how to behave appropriately at school. We, therefore, have rising expectations for them to behave according to the Code of Conduct. We also carefully consider each child when determining consequences - what is appropriate in terms of consequence for one child may not be for another. Our primary goal in establishing consequences is to help students reflect on their actions and behaviours and learn from their mistakes.

School Routines and Procedures

Attendance

In the interest of the child's progress at school, it is important to maintain regular attendance and to arrive on time. However, when absence or late arrival is necessary, we ask you to note the following procedures:

- Absences Please leave a message on the school's Callback Phone at 604-903-3711 (phone line open 24 hours per day) before 8:40 am if your child will be absent that day or arriving late.
- If emailing classroom teacher about an absence, please also contact the school office with the information.
- When calling, please state your child's name, their teacher's name, division or grade, and a brief explanation for their absence when you call. Please include symptoms if ill.
- If your child does not arrive on time for school, and we are not aware of a planned absence, a staff member at the school will attempt to contact you, or any of your approved emergency contact numbers. Please make sure your emergency contact phone numbers are up to date.

Students who arrive late or leave early must be signed in/out at the office. Late Arrivals (children who arrive after 8:44 am) must check in at the office before proceeding to class.

Supervision at School

All students are encouraged to arrive at school shortly before the first bell in the morning. Parents should be aware that there is no supervision of students on the playground prior to the start of school or after 3:00 pm dismissal.

In order to foster independence, parents are encouraged to say goodbye to students outside the school and allow them to enter the school on their own.

Supervision Aides and Education Aides provide supervision of students during the recess and lunch breaks. Students need to be dressed for the weather as it is our expectation that <u>all students will play outside</u>, even in inclement weather.

Intermediate students who stay at school for lunch go outside at 12:15 pm when the first bell rings. Primary students go outside at 12:20 pm.

Students who go home for lunch should sign out at the office when they leave, and sign back in when they return. For safety reasons, students are not permitted to go out for lunch unless they are accompanied by an adult. Students who are having lunch at home must have a written note of permission from their parents to go to another child's home.

Valuables

Students who choose to bring to valuables (electronic devices, jewelry, money, special toys, trading cards, etc.) to school run the risk of these items going missing. The School District cannot accept any responsibility or liability for damaged, lost, or stolen items brought to school by students. Students should not bring high-value items to school if they are not comfortable with the possibility these items may get lost or damaged. Families, please help your child make wise decisions about what to/not to bring to school.

Bicycles, Skateboards & Scooters

We encourage students to wheel to school. Please ensure helmets are worn at all times. Once on school property, bicycles must be walked to the bike racks and locked during school hours. Scooters, skateboards, and hover boards must be walked or carried into classrooms and stored safely out of the way. Again, the school accepts no responsibility for lost, damaged, or stolen "wheels".

Clothing

Students should come to school dressed in clothing that allows them to get through the day comfortably and safely (clothes that will keep them warm and dry and foot attire suitable for school activities). For some children, having an extra set of clothing at school is helpful during inclement weather.

Learning at Montroyal

Montroyal offers a full range of programs to meet the diverse needs of students, including in class diversification to address a broad learning continuum, a learning assistance program, an English as an additional language program and gifted programing. Montroyal students are encouraged to be conscientious learners and leaders in their school.

Home Learning

Teachers will often ask students to practice basic skills, practice reading, work on long term projects, or finish assignments not completed in class, at home. If you are finding that your child is spending a significant amount of time on homework, please contact your child's teacher.

The students are encouraged to be cooperative and highly involved in a variety of school activities, ranging from academics, to the arts, to team sports. At Montroyal, we believe a well-rounded education is not just the three R's; success in the future will require digital-age literacy, inventive thinking, effective communication and high productivity.

What All Parents Need to Know

Volunteers

Parents and community members who are working in classrooms or volunteering in the school are reminded that they need to sign in at the office and receive a visitor's tag to wear while they are in the building, or on the school grounds. This helps with the safety and security of students.

Please note: Due to COVID protocol, parent volunteers may be limited during the 2021/2022 school year.

A confidentiality declaration is required by all parents who volunteer in the school. This declaration is needed to ensure that the privacy of our students is protected. Parents are asked not to be on the playgrounds during recess and lunch breaks as this makes supervision more difficult for staff members.

Parking Lot
