erase - expect respect & a safe education

erase is about building safe and caring school communities. This includes empowering students, families, educators and the community partners who support them to get help with challenges, report concerns to schools, and learn about complex issues facing students. erase started in 2004 through the provincial government's Safe, Caring and Orderly Schools Strategy, and has since evolved.

Families are encouraged to review the resources and information found on the erase website with their children, including about online safety, mental health and well-being, substance abuse, bullying, racism, sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) and more. There is also a reporting tool to get help and support.

Starting on November 16, the school district and school websites will feature erase on the homepage rotating banner. We are doing this to increase awareness of this resource. You can expect to see erase shared on school district and school websites periodically throughout the school year.

Indigenous Veterans' Day & Remembrance Day

Next Wednesday, November 8th at school we will recognize Indigenous Veterans Day (recognized in Canada on November 8) and Remembrance Day (recognized in Canada on November 11). We will have a school-wide assembly on Wednesday to recognize the contributions and sacrifices of Indigenous and Canadian Veterans to past and current wars. During the assembly, we will also show respect for veterans from all parts of the world, as well as show empathy for people affected by past and present wars. Currently in the school, Ms. Sonja has put together a bulletin board to recognize Indigenous and non-Indigenous veterans. If you have someone in your family who is a war veteran and would like him/her to be honoured at school, please provide a photo and/or a short write-up to Ms. Kelly (K. Sangha) so that we can add it to our honour board.
