Emergency Student Release Drill - June 7

During the afternoon of Friday, June 7th, we will be having an emergency student release drill. The purpose of this drill is for us to practice procedures we would have to follow in the event of an emergency that would require us to release students from the school early. Examples of times we might need to do so include prolonged power outages or natural disasters. During the drill, parents/caregivers or your approved alternate guardians indicated on your Student Release Form are asked to come to the school to pick up your child, following the emergency release procedures. It is not required to take time off work to pick up your child early, however, we encourage as many families as possible to participate in this drill. When you or your alternate arrive to pick up your child, please **make sure you have photo identification such as a drivers' license or passport**. Children will only be released to their parent/caregiver or approved alternate guardian. Also, we will appreciate your patience as it takes time to go through the required procedures of the release. We will send out further details related to this drill in a subsequent communication.

School Fees & School Supplies for 2024-25

For the 2024-25 school year, the following will be charged as school fees:

Kindergarten - \$55 fee for school supplies that will be purchased by the classroom teacher(s)

Grades 1-3 - \$7 fee for a required agenda book used daily to teach planning and organizational skills, and as a communication tool between parents and teachers

Please note: For parents'/caregivers' convenience, school supply kits for students in Grades 1-7 will be available to order through School Start, a Canadian company. We will aim to keep the cost of

supply kits as close to \$60 as possible. If you'd prefer to shop locally for your child's school supplies, we will provide you a list of the required supplies (same as those in the kit).

AI Supports for Parents/Caregivers and Students
