

We are very excited to be able to hold our "Holiday Market" again this year! This is set up for our primary students (Grades K-3) to "shop" at school for gifts to give to their family members. Money is not required but we are encouraging students to bring loonies, toonies, toonies, or other coins for "transactions" as a way for students to experience "purchasing" something (teaching financial literacy!). All students will be allowed to "shop" even if they do not bring any \$, and all funds collected will be donated to the Family Services North Shore.

When: Students (Kindergarten to Gr 3) Shopping: Tuesday, December 16th and Wednesday

December 17th (classes will be scheduled for a "shopping" time)

Where: Queen Mary's Art Room

Purpose: To allow the primary students the opportunity to "shop" (using \$1, \$2, and other small

change, as described above) for gifts for family - to experience the pleasure and joy of

giving!

How this works:

Gently used or new items are "donated" for the holiday market by our community members and families – anyone can donate so spread the word! A wonderful way to clean out closets and "re-gift"!!

Donated items can be dropped off in front of the main office by parents or sent with students to be handed in at the school office up until Dec 15th

Examples of items to donate:

- Wrapping paper and/or gift bags, name tags/cards
- New Items: soaps, hand and body creams, shaving lotion, and other toiletries; tea, coffee, hot
 chocolate, candies or other packaged "goodies", chocolates; housewares, tea towels, candles,
 socks, hats, stuffies, etc... (dollar store is a good source for many of these types of items)
- Gently Used Items: books, cards/small games, stuffies, toys, ties, bracelets, decorations, mittens or gloves, scarves (cleaned), coffee/tea cups, etc...
- **Nothing too big or breakable please as young children will be carrying these gifts home.
- Items will set out on tables to create a "market" experience. Students will be brought in during the day by their teachers to "shop" for items that they will give as gifts to family members.
