## Getting Ready for a Healthy School Year

#### ✓ Are their immunizations up to date?

Boosters recommended starting at 4 years of age prior to K entry:

- Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis, Polio (DPTPo)
- Chicken Pox, Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMRV)

#### ✓ Do they have any medical conditions?

 Communicate with school staff if your child needs extra help anaphylaxis (severe allergy), diabetes, seizures, asthma and/or any other complex medical needs.

#### √ Preventing spread of illness

- Washing your hands is one of the best ways to stop the spread of germs.
  - Help your children learn to wash their hands with soap and water(for at least 20 seconds) after using the washroom and before eating.

#### √When do I keep my child home if they are sick?

- Children who are showing signs of illness (fever, cough, runny nose) should stay home until they are well enough to participate in regular activities.
- If vomiting or have diarrhea they can return to school when they no longer have any symptoms.

- NVSD is partnered with The Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP), a research institute at the University of British Columbia, to do the Childhood Experiences Questionnaire (CHEQ).
- NVSD has partnered with UBC HELP for several years to conduct the Early Development Questionnaire and Middle Years Development Questionnaire to better understand the needs of our learning community and provide appropriate supports
