Attendance Matters

Please make sure you share with your child the importance of attending school regularly - children attend school - it's their job! Being on time for school is a valuable life skill. Being on time is showing responsibility and reduces the interruptions to the morning routines.

Our first bell rings at 8:45, and students are expected to be in their classroom ready to learn by 8:50. Please ensure your child's teacher has been informed (with a note) that your child will be arriving late or leaving during the day (dentist, etc.) Please contact your child's teacher if you have any concerns. Please contact the school (604-903-3730) if your child will be away due to illness, or other circumstance.

Student's success at school

A student's success at school can be greatly influenced by how they are feeling on any given day. Students are able to function better and think more clearly while at school if they have the following:

- a minimum of 9 hours of sleep (reduce exposure to screen time for a minimum of one hour prior to bedtime)
- eat a healthy breakfast that includes protein
- reduction of sugary snacks
- engage in physical activity for a minimum of 90 minutes per day

Building Resiliency in Children - a focus for Queensbury this year

Resilience is the ability to meet and overcome challenges in ways that maintain or promote well-being. It is the ability to stay in control, push through perceived setbacks and see a solution. At Queensbury we are working with our students to encourage them to persevere, and to be resilient when things don't always go as planned. So although children may look for an easy fix to a difficult situation, our staff is teaching them to identify the problem (perceived or otherwise), identify possible solutions and to work through the difficult times. It's important that we support our students and to provide an opportunity to show them that "they can do it!" Getting through small disappointments and difficulties helps children to become resilient when larger, much more challenging situations arise.
