IMPORTANT NEWS

As we progress through the school year, we want to take a moment to emphasize two critical areas that significantly influence our students' success, well-being, and overall development: **sleep** and **screen time**. These factors play a pivotal role in helping children thrive both academically and personally.

The Importance of Sleep: A good night's sleep is essential for children to learn, grow, and fully engage in the exciting opportunities each day offers. According to experts, school-aged children should ideally get **9-11 hours of sleep** each night to support their physical and mental development. Proper rest contributes to:

- Improved focus and concentration in the classroom.
- **Better memory retention**, helping students absorb and apply new concepts.
- **Enhanced emotional well-being**, fostering a positive school experience.

We understand that busy family schedules and extracurricular activities can make consistent sleep routines challenging, but prioritizing adequate rest can make a world of difference in your child's day-to-day life.

Mindful Screen Time Management: Another crucial aspect to consider is the **impact of screen time**, particularly during evening hours. Excessive screen exposure, especially close to bedtime, can disrupt the body's natural production of melatonin—a hormone critical for sleep regulation. This can make it harder for children to fall asleep and maintain restorative sleep patterns.

To support healthier habits:

- Set clear screen time limits during school nights.
- Establish **technology-free zones** in bedrooms or family spaces.
- Encourage evening routines that include **calming activities**, such as reading a book or quiet conversations, to help wind down before bed.

By promoting consistent sleep habits and healthy screen use, we can work together to ensure students are equipped to make the most of their school experience. 2025-2026 ELEMENTARY BAND INFORMATION

Our school will continue providing the band program for next school year. Registration for the 2025/26 Elementary Band and Strings program opened on Monday, January 15. For more information, please click <u>HERE</u>. There are two registration options and fees:

- 1. Registration between January 13 February 28, 2024 the fee is \$550 and can be paid through a monthly instalment plan that will be in place until September 1.
- 2. Registration between March 14 September 29, 2024 (Late Registration) the fee will be \$620. No monthly installment plan is available for this option.

Families can withdraw their child from the program and receive a FULL refund up to June 13, 2025. After this date, a \$75 withdrawal fee will be charged. There are no refunds after September 29, 2025.
