Monday Message

Dear Ross Road Families,

As part of our ongoing school-wide learning connected to social-emotional learning and self-regulation using the "Second Step" program, the focus for the next four weeks for students in K-5 is on Emotion Management. This week, classes are discussing 'Feelings in My Body'. Students are learning that everyone feels a lot of different feelings. Some of these are conformable and others are not but all of them are okay. Students are learning to pay attention to the feelings and see if they can name them. Students in grade 6 & 7 are covering a variety of topics including mindset and goals, recognizing bullying and harassment, thoughts, emotions and decisions, and managing relationships and social conflict.
